



The rise and rise of auction.

As more and more sellers decide that auction is the best method for them to sell their property, we felt it the perfect time to talk about what it takes to get ready to bid at auction. We appreciate this can appear to be quite a daunting task but if you know what you're doing it's the most transparent and informed way to buy property in the market today.

Once you identify that you like the look of an auction property, the first thing to understand is that bidding is on a cash and unconditional basis. In other words, you complete your due diligence prior to bidding at auction instead of once you make an offer. To assist with this you will generally find the seller provides you with a property information pack which will include a Land Information Memorandum (LIM), Title, EQC information, insurance information and more often than not, a Building Inspection - which is great!

It is then really important that you work closely with the listing salesperson, your bank, your insurer and your solicitor to review this information - we suggest following a process like this:

 Register your interest & obtain a copy of the property information pack. If you are interested in the property be sure to let the sales consultant who showed you the home know. This ensures that if another buyer makes a pre auction offer and the owners accept that offer, then the sales consultant is able to contact all interested parties

- Have the Title, LIM and Particulars and Conditions of Sale approved by your solicitor prior to bidding.
- Have your finances arranged to coincide with the date of settlement and possession. Also make sure you are able to pay a 10% deposit on the fall of the hammer by electronic bank transfer.
- Speak with an insurance company to make sure you can obtain insurance on the property from the settlement date if you are the successful purchaser.
- Request any variations to the Particulars and Conditions of Sale by way of an Aside Agreement Such variations must be discussed with your sales consultant prior to auction day. They will then seek the seller's approval.
- You will need to complete and sign an Auction Bidding Registration and Consent By Purchaser form prior to bidding. This form will be in the property information pack but your sales consultant will provide one upon request.

Once you've completed your due diligence then you're ready for action!



What questions can you ask?

The Privacy Commission recently released guidelines around what information a landlord can legally request from a tenant when they are applying for a rental property and, on the surface, this can look like a scary prospect. However, as in most of the changes in legislation we come across in our industry, when you dig a little deeper and have processes in place it is in fact not quite what you first thought.

Discrimination has of course, and rightly so, never been allowed when choosing your tenants and this includes anything from race, religion, sexual orientation or anything else which will of course not actually affect the tenancy.

The ethos of the new legislation is essentially that landlords are only permitted to collect information needed for a lawful purpose connected to finding tenants and managing tenancies.

The major change which has got landlords up in arms is that we are no longer allowed to request employment status at the first part of the application process. This of course upset landlords as it does seem reasonable and not in breach of privacy or any human rights to ascertain whether a tenant can pay the rent each week.

However, as I mentioned, when you look

further into

the legislation and weigh up when it is reasonable to collect essential information, at a later point it can be done. What this means is that a tenant application process will become a four step process. As opposed to collecting all of the information on the initial application form, it will have to be staggered.

It is quite a complex process and if you get it wrong, come March 2022, you could be hit with a fine of up to \$10,000 so if you have any questions please feel free to give me a call.

change your stress levels by changing what vou eat.

what we eat. There is nothing on this planet that can replace a nourishing way of eating and we can support the biochemical pathways that promote a sense of calm in the body through what we consume. Here are some tips to consider.

Increase your nutrients

In today's world, most of our stress is

If you are not getting enough nutrients, your body simply doesn't have the tools it needs to be able to support the millions of biochemical processes that promote great health. Any nutrient deficiency creates stress for the systems that run your body so make a conscious effort to boost your nourishment with more home-cooked meals and additional serves of vegetables.

Foods that promote calm

Certain foods help to support a variety of interior pathways which promote a sense of calm. Some examples include foods rich in omega-3 fatty acids such as oily fish for their anti-inflammatory actions, those rich in magnesium such as green leafy vegies for their relaxing properties, and vitamin C-rich foods such as citrus and broccoli for their adrenal support.

Increase antioxidants

Stress hormones create free radicals which are unpaired units of oxygen (or other elements which run around our body causing havoc when in excess). Antioxidants donate part of themselves (electrons) to free radicals which quells their destructive tendencies and reduces oxidative stress. Coloured plant foods—think berries, red cabbage, leafy greens—are bursting with antioxidants. Eat the rainbow for a large array of nutritious substances.

Stress can deplete us of certain minerals yet there are some that are necessary for a true sense of calm. Magnesium plays a key role in hormone production, and it also helps to reduce anxious feelings and relaxes muscles. Calcium is vital for maintaining pH levels in our blood, as well as for relaxation. If stress has been ongoing and persistent for you, you may benefit from supplementing these minerals for a period alongside a nourishing way of eating.

Avoid low-carb eating

While there are many carbohydrate-based products on the market today that are not at all nourishing, carbs themselves play an integral role in our energy production and are the preferred source of energy for the brain and red blood cells. Not eating enough carbs can affect blood sugar levels. Healthy blood glucose sits within a scale of 3.5-7 mmol/L and if your body drops to the lower end of that scale, it has several mechanisms it can employ to bring it back up. Jawline and chin treatments with dermal fillers are extremely effective and are one of the most popular cosmetic treatments for both women and men.

By using fillers (and sometimes Botox as discussed in last month's issue) we can reshape and recontour the face. Providing sharp definition to the jawline addresses sagging skin and jowls as well as lifting the skin back to tighten the lower face and neck.

As we age, the shape of the bony jaw changes - it loses height and recedes so the skin begins to droop over the side. Fillers can lift this back into place and give a sharper more elegant jawline. 



- Add the tomato paste, chutney and mayonnaise. Sprinkle over the flour, stir well, then add the milk and cook, stirring, over a medium heat until the sauce is thickened and creamy. Remove from the heat, add the grapes, spring onions, parsley, almonds and turkey. Cool.





It's been a month to celebrate the calibre of young people across the district, which is fitting timing following my recent appointment as National's Youth Spokesperson.

I'm thrilled to announce my new Youth MP Oxford Area School Year 11 student Hillary Cooper, who impressed the interview panel with her enthusiasm for her original project idea that sealed the deal.

She told the panel how going on a defensive driving course equipped her with the confidence to drive on the open road. As a rural teenager, having that independence has been key for her and she wants to use her role as Youth MP to help other young people in Waimakariri learn to drive safely on the electorate's open roads.

Hillary convinced me how important it is for community safety that our young drivers have the skills they need to drive defensively and safely. She told me young people in Waimakariri struggle to get where they need to be with parents working and driver licence fees and accessibility to lessons often out of reach.

Hillary will be reaching out to young people across Waimakariri to get their feedback ahead of Youth Parliament on 19 and 20 July 2022.
