

Healthy Homes Standards What you need to know

The recently announced Healthy Homes Standards (HHS), is one of the bot topics on landlord's minds at present. There seems to be a lot of rumours circulating on what the requirements under the HHS are, so I have put together some information to clarify the situation.

I believe that it is important to remember there are still real benefits in owning rental property in New Zealand. The HHS are here to ensure that we as a country are providing, warm, healthy homes to our tenants, and the added benefit to this is, that we are also

Ministry of Housing and Urban Development have advised; "One-third of New Zealand households (nearly 600,000) rent, and rental homes tend to be older and of poorer quality than owner occupied dwellings.

Tenants have less autonomy to make improvements to their homes than owner

occupiers, and maintaining and improving the quality of the dwelling is the responsibility of the owner.

While many landlords maintain and upgrade their properties, there are some who don't, leaving tenants living in cold, damp homes.

Healthy ords will Standards make it easier for tenants to achieve warmer, drier homes, helping to reduce mould and damp and the potential for associated health conditions. They will also provide a clear set of minimum standards all landlords will need to provide their tenants."

Below are the Healthy Homes Standards recently released

Heating: A fixed heating device - heat pump, woodburner or flued gas heater which heats to a minimum temperature of 18 degrees celsius in the living room only.

 Insulation : Ceiling insulation must meet the 2008 Building Code, or be a minimum of 120mm thickness if existing.

· Ventilation : Windows which can be opened in all living, dining, kitchen and bedrooms.

Extractor fans must also be installed in any room with a bath, shower or indoor cooktop. The Real Estate Institute has asked the Government if a fitted shower dome will be acceptable - we are waiting to hear the outcome of that.

· Moisture Ingress and Drainage : Efficient drainage and gutterings, downpipes and drains. If the property has

an enclosed subfloor, there must be a ground moisture barrier.

· Draught Stopping: Stop all unnecessary gaps or holes in walls, ceilings, windows, doors and floors. All unused fireplaces and chimneys must be blocked.

For a lot of landlords, their property may already be compliant, however it will be important to ensure that accurate records are provided which will eliminate any doubts.

Ferrero Rocher Terrine

Easter is a great time to spend with family and friends. If you are entertaining over the Easter break and are looking for something spectacular to serve up to your guests try this Chocolate Terrine from Ferrero Rocher. The recipe is simple to follow, if you don't want to melt the chocolate over boiling water it is easy to melt in the microwave in 45 second bursts, just remember to stir between each stage to help melt the chocolate. When I made the Terrine I doubled the recipe as I had a big loaf tin so remember to use a small loaf tin otherwise you will run out of mixture to fill the tin. This is very decadent so one small slice is enough with a glass of Brown Brothers Rose Prosecco.

INGREDIENTS

400g jar of Nutella 250g dark chocolate

500g milk chocolate

120g hazelnuts, lightly toasted, skinned and coarsely chopped

12 hazelnuts to serve (optional)

15 mixed Ferrero Rocher, to serve

- 1. Place 1/2 of the dark chocolate in a bowl over simmering water. Stir until almost melted and remove from heat. Add remaining chocolate and stir until completely smooth.
- 2. Pour half the melted dark chocolate into a 1.2 litre loaf tin (make sure you measure the tin otherwise you may run out of filling if the tin is too big) tilting the pan using a pastry brush to ensure an even coating, Tap on bench to release air bubbles then tip excess chocolate bake in the bowl. Refrigerate pan for a few minutes to set. Repeat with a second layer of dark chocolate then chill again and reserve the remaining
- 3. Melt the milk chocolate in a bowl over simmering water. Fold in Nutella and chopped nuts. Pour into chocolate coated pan and level, tapping gently to remove air bubbles.
- 4. When the filling is cool. Cover with remaining dark chocolate and refrigerate overnight.
- 5. Make toffee hazelnuts by placing sugar in a small pan, heat stirring occasionally, until melted and toffee coloured. Insert a toothpick into each hazelmut and dip and dip into the toffee, tap off excess and leave to
- 6. Remove terrine from pan and place on platter. Decorate with toffee hazelnuts and Ferrero Rocher using a dash of melted chocolate. Serve at room temperature. Cut with a sharp knife run under boiling water

Don't take our word for it, come and taste it!

St Patrick's Day (or compulsory drink a Stout day) has been and gone, but with the odd autumnal morning and the shortening days I thought I'd talk about a colourful, rich beer that's suited to the cooler weather. Stout. I happen to be brewing one today and unfortunately it's not "playing ball" so I have plenty of time to do other things like write a column for Essence and think about which Brew Moon pizza I'm going to have for my dinner tonight, because I'll almost certainly be here at that time.

The term 'stout' was originally used in relation to beer in the 1600s, but at that time it simply meant a strong beer. In the 1700s, Porter became hugely popular with the "working classes" in London because it was more flavourful, kept well and it was very cheap. The word Stout was used to describe the stronger, higher alcohol Porters. The Irish developed a taste for Porter and large quantities were exported to Ireland. By the early 1800s Arthur Guinness had seen the opportunity and opened his brewery in St James's Gate, Dublin, brewing Stout Porters and the rest, as they say, is history! Interestingly Guinness these days isn't a strong beer, it's around 4.2%. But who wants to talk about Guinness; they are owned by Diageo, one of the biggest drinks companies in the world who also own iconic NZ winery, Cloudy Bay (all is not as it seems in the drinks biz).

The great thing about dark beer is that it's incredibly good for you, packed full of iron, antioxidants and flavonoids, and the darker the beer the more it has. Forget red wine, this stuff is the real deal because unlike wine it doesn't contain any preservatives. Well let's say that all Brew Moon beers, and I'd magine most craft beers, don't contain preservatives. However, preservatives are a legal additive for beer in NZ so check that label. Stout was historically given to new Mums, Lexpect to boost their iron levels, but the added bonus of a zonked out newborn must have been a factor!

Our Stout, "Dark Side of the Moon" is a stout Stout; it's about 6% alcohol and round and soft rather than dry and bitter. This is due to the rich dark malts we use which give the beer not only its colour, but a swag of flavours including chocolate, molasses and coffee. When I finally finish brewing this one I think I'll have a Dark Side, and rather than a pizza, I'll have a Brew Moon burger to celebrate. Those toasty, rich flavours go so well with a burger cooked in a wood-fired oven.







When purchasing a chainsaw make sure you purchase a chainsaw that is correct for the job at

Discuss with your salesperson before buying and ensure you have the right safety equipment; helmet with muffs and visor, chaps and safety boots.

Before starting use you should refuel and oil your saw, check the chain is sharp and adjusted correctly.

that the oil pump is working, by a small trace of oil leaving a line on the log.

After running for a few minutes and things have warmed up recheck and readjust the chain tension.

While cutting the wood keep an eye on the wood chip coming off the chain and if the chip starts to turn to dust you need to stop and sharpen the chain. Don't wait until the fuel tank is empty as this can lead to premature wear of the bar and chain due to

Recently there has been two new grasses that offer both our dryland and irrigated farmers more options. when considering pasture renovations.

This autumn there has been a limited release of a new cocksfoot called Aurus from PGG Wrightson Seeds.

The use of cocksfoots is growing yearly as plant breeders have vastly improved cocksfoots performance. The newer generation cultivars certainly bear little resemblance to the old cultivars.

Aurus is an upright winter active cocksfoot with a parentage that combines Uruguayan and French genetics, This combination offers both strong winter growth and overall total yield. Breeders and agronomists have selected Aurus for a later heading date (+6 days later than Tekapo) with strong disease resistance.

Aurus cocksfoot should be sown in early autumn or spring with white clovers such as Hilltop (smallmedium leaf) or Quartz (medium leaf). Aurus like most cocksfoot is best suited to low - medium fertility soil.

Cocksfoots are generally slower to establish than their speedy ryegrass cousins, and therefore, early grazings of them and ryegrass mixes should be frequent and light, using large mobs to reduce competition from the ryegrass. Aurus is no exception to this rule.

While autumn isn't the best time for establishing tall fescues. However, it's a good time to introduce you to Agricoms latest tall fescue release "Hummer."

Hummer is a soft-leaved and fine tillered early heading cultivar with seed head emergence starting in late September. The plant breeders have maintained the productivity and persistence of the early heading types while improving the palatability. Hummer a fine tillered cultivar and is sod-forming which create dense crowns over time; an important trait of persistent tall fescue. Trials have shown Hummer

to have very good late winter and early spring growth which is normally a very

important time for farmers. Hummer is deep-rooted fescue suitable for both dryland or irrigated farms and its large root

mass can be found deeper than the rooting depth of perennial ryegrass. This root structure and the strong crowning habit of Hummer helps it to be naturally tolerant of grass grub while the presence of MaxP® endophyte extends its insect tolerance markedly

Does having a rental car in Europe sound a little daunting - it sounds harder than it really is. I (Liz) discovered a few useful tip and tricks if you are planning on exploring Europe on 4 wheels.

 It is well worth the extra cost to get an automatic, even if you drive a manual car here in New Zealand it is just one less thing to think about. Remember when you stop at intersections you are trying to deal with foreign road signs, different road rules and everything in the car on the opposite side – trust us, an automatic is well worth the few extra dollars.

 Don't go for too big a car if you don't need it as many of the small villages have very narrow streets and roads and little space for parking. Just something big enough to fit the number of passengers and your luggage securely hidden in the boot.

Never leave anything in the car if it is unattended, leave the glovebox and coin areas open to show it is empty and make sure the parcel rack is over your luggage in the boot.

 After you have arrived at your hotel it is a good idea to back against a wall or fence when parking, so the boot is harder to access.

Local Mechanics Starring Role with the World's Best.

In last month's Essence I did a piece on Ken Block and his monster 1400 hp Mustang blasting its way up Pike's Peak. A lot of feedback came in, particularly from people dialling up KB's amazing You Tube videos and seeing him in action for the first time. However, one call was a little different. Rangiora woman, Gloria Cherry told me that her son, Gregg Hamilton has been part of Ken Block's Hoonigan Racing Division for about 14 years through Subaru USA and Hoonigan. Gregg, a panel beater by trade, is now a problem-solving mechanic and an integral part of Ken Block's Park City, Utahbased organisation.

Gregg's journey has led him from Papanui High to Raxworthy Panelbeaters (now European) to Tein Autosport in Japan. He came back to NZ to open Tein Autosport in Auckland, then on to Prodrive in England. Toyota in Germany followed and then it was off to Charlotte NC with the Red Bull Nascar team. He moved to Vermont with Subaru and it was there he met Ken Block and the legendary Travis Pastrana, Gregg followed KB when he left Subaru and went on to establish the Hoonigan Racing Division, switching from Subaru to the blue oval. Incidentally, Gloria says that Gregg has told

her that KB is a great guy and he loves working with him, 'Work hard, play hard' is very much the HRD

The Hoonigan Racing Division is closely associated with Ford Performance Division,

Boots 'n All: Seven Rules for Rural Trustees - Part 1


For all the conversation around the role and responsibilities of the trustees of New Zealand's 450,000 or so family trusts, a big part of the discussion has been missing: specifically, the special tasks and obligations facing a trustee of an entity based in rural New Zealand.

What is special about the role of the person we call a 'rural trustee'? It all goes back to New Zealand's primary industry-based economy and the disproportionate - by global comparative standards - amount of wealth that sits in farms and other agriculture-based businesses, which are often familyowned enterprises that have grown larger and more complex over generations. It is estimated more than 50% of rural properties in New Zealand are owned by

Against this backdrop, rural trustees should be operating in accordance with a handful of fairly simple yet ironclad rules. Over the next few issues David will discuss these, starting with two now:

- 1. The fundamentals of trusteeship apply. A good trustee welds technical knowhow with relationship skills. A rural trustee will maintain a variety of interpersonal relationships, some with other professional advisers (lawyers and accountants, most commonly) and others with the various members of the family (of which the trustee may be a member or a professional outsider). Maintaining professionalism while devoting equal time and energy to multiple beneficiaries takes skill, experience and good instincts. The trustee coordinates expert advisers and advice, and maintains sound records and governance, to ensure the integrity of the trust is maintained. This includes ensuring decisions are made in accordance with the terms of the trust deed.
- 2. Listen to your clients, but maintain a professional distance. The job of a rural trustee can be a delicate dance; you must know your clients well, and you may work with them over many years, but you must keep your place as a professional service provider rather than a friend. This can be especially tricky when the trustee is part of the family involved in the trust. The overriding responsibility is to understand from the trust beneficiaries what their desired outcomes are. The trustee must have a sound awareness of how the family operates and what its collective goals are, and stay close enough to monitor and accommodate the inevitable changes over time.

All trustees should be aware of the changes they will surely face when the new Trust Act is introduced and perhaps now is the time to ensure they have the basics in hand, Perpetual Guardian offers a comprehensive trust management service to existing trustees, and provides professional advice in area of trust formation and management.

Lifestyle block owners in the Waimakariri know how much hard work is required to keep on top of things. It's not for nothing they're sometimes referred to as life-sentence blocks.

Whether it's chooks, fruit trees and a vege patch, or some sheep and perhaps a Ilama, it's a Kiwi dream and often an affordable alternative for those seeking a modest home out of the more expensive urban areas. Not having waterborne sewerage and refuse collection or even a sealed road — and having to drive further to get the kids to activities or friends are sacrifices many are prepared to pay.

It's about choice. Something we, as New Zealanders,

However, if Government succeeds with its capital gains tax, families selling a modest three-bedroom family home on a patch of land over 4500 square metres with an asking price of as low as \$260k will have to hand over 33 percent of the gains to Government, while palatial, multi-million dollar family homes in established, leafy urban suburbs will be tax free.

Doesn't seem fair, does it?

Unfortunately, it doesn't stop there.

If you've taken in flatmates or boarders to help pay the mortgage, even to help pay off a family home on a smaller section, you could be handing over a percentage to Inland Revenue as a capital gains tax. KiwiSaver investors and small, home-based businesses will also get caught in the net. Few will have the appetite to face the struggle of establishing a start-up, going without to be one of the 20 percent to make it past the first five years or to keep the business going through the lean years, only to have to hand over 33 percent of the gains made over the lifetime of the business when it comes time to retire.

Government's proposed capital gains tax would be one of the most aggressive in the OECD. Shouldn't we rather be backing our families and small businesses to get ahead by growing our local economy to support more jobs and higher incomes in Waimakariri?

The reassuring sight, after the hateful tragedy in Christchurch recently, of police officers carrying long arms in public got me thinking about public security

We are fortunate that in rural Canterbury we have some of the lowest crime rates in New Zealand, in the national context of crime rates dropping anyway. This does not, however, mean that we should be

As in most of the western world. New Zealand councils try to use what are known as CPTED principles (Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design, often pronounced "septed") when planning town centres, parks, etc. This means that we try not to have places where there are dark corners where people cannot see into, that there is good lighting at night and places in which people of all ages feel comfortable. Making provision for cafes to spread outside, having lots of seats and making sure plantings do not provide hiding places all contribute to our feeling secure.

In Rangiora and Kaiapoi there are also security cameras in and adjacent to the two main streets. These, when they were first installed, had a noticeable effect on the amount of graffiti and other manifestations of undesirable behaviour. While I certainly don't want to live in the kind of country where cameras could track my every movement, I have always supported the Council funding their presence in the centres of our two largest towns.

The cameras are often operated by volunteers, and they are backed-up in a number of areas by volunteer community patrols in Kaiapoi, Rangiora, Pegasus, Oxford, etc. While they can't be out 24/7, the patrols and camera operators perform a useful function in providing "eyes and ears" for the police. I think we all realise that police resources are never going to cover every pressure point - to make a hypothetical observation, if officers are dealing with an assault in Oxford, it is going to take a while for them to get to some antisocial behaviour in Pines Beach, for

The community patrols are always looking for volunteers, but even if we can't all be involved in them, in the end, safety in public spaces is a partnership between the community, the police and bodies like the council.



The mine field that's ACC

You'll recall in the last two editions I've been talking about ACC. In particular how that affects those of us that are self-employed or small business owners. What I've called "the minefield that is ACC" because in these circumstances it is indeed a minefield. Because ACC is both a default system and designed for the majority, when it comes to income compensation, it works very well for those of us that are employed. Not so well where our income is variable because of what we do and how we do it.

However, there is one part of ACC that affects everyone regardless of how we earn our livelihood, and that is claims. Both for the medical costs and income compensation.

Let's go back to my very first column on ACC. You'll recall I talked about why we have ACC and when ACC accept liability for both medical cost and income compensation. ACC was first formed in order to negate the need for private litigation when an accident occurs, and the victim suffers a loss. A loss could be either (or both and, often is) the cost of the medical treatment or loss of income as a result of being unable to work.

We've all heard and seen what happens in such places as the US where there is no ACC. Private litigation is how victims are compensated for their loss. You'll have heard the stories of lawyers following ambulances to tout for business on a "no win, no fee" basis. Very messy and often very unjust, for both parties!!

So, we have ACC. ACC accept liability in the case of an accident. So, what is an accident? I guess it could be best described as a specific incident, that causes a specific injury, on a specific day at a specific time. Most of the time that's really easy. If you have a fall and break your leg as a direct result of that fall, it is deemed an accident and you

But what happens if after a number of years your leg starts playing up again. Is that a direct result of the fall? Or an accident? Arguably not. Just wear and tear with age. This where ACC's liability become somewhat blurred. And in recent times they have become at lot more stringent on what they will accept liability for. Those issues that result over a

longer period of time, either through sports or work, are less likely to be accepted by ACC.

What do we do then if we can't work? What do we do when our sick leave runs out? Then our annual leave runs out? What then? And, by the way, only 25% of us who can't work are incapacitated as a result of an accident. 75% of us are incapacitated by an ailment, not an injury. No ACC herell

Private income protection come in many different forms, Private

depending on such things as age, occupation, health, debt and so on. It's a complicated matter and needs appropriate advice.

But, if you think ill health only happens to others and never to you, then think again. Illness, especially serious illness is not discriminatory. It can happen to any of us at any age from any background. If you rely on physical exertion to create your income, to pay your bills and keep the lifestyle you and your family are accustomed to, then you need to talk to us about your best options to ensure that your income continues when you can't work.
