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


Corporate Chiseled Challenge

Q. How can I invest to get a higher return

From Rangiora High School student to baking business magnate – we caught up with Dean Brettschneider to find out the secrets of his success.

Type Dean Brettschneider into the Google search bar and the autocomplete options include 'sourdough recipe' and 'net worth'. They seem like a strange combo – but perhaps not for a man who has created his own personal brand as the Global Baker.

Today Dean owns several businesses in Singapore including an artisan bakery chain Baker & Cook, a pizza brand Plank Sourdough, Mo & Jo a burger brand, Crosstown Doughnuts and his own baking and cooking school. Oh, and he does some consultancy work around the globe. So is working non-stop basically the key to business success?

"You have to be relentless, you know," says Dean speaking from Singapore. "Relentless on yourself, on your relationships, on your family. Relentless on yourself physically. I think that was part of the motivation to write the biography really. I felt there was a story to be told about that side of it."

Dean's biography, Passion Is My Main Ingredient, does show behind the scenes. And it's exhausting. He's winning awards, he's buying a bakery, he's working for corporates, he's in London, he's in Shanghai, he's writing baking books, he's on television. He simply doesn't stop.

He attributes that drive to various sources. Growing up in Waikuku Beach he recalls putting Readers Digest books down his socks as shin pads for soccer.

"I came from nothing. And so it was very important to me to be able to provide," he says.

But he also experienced an early taste of hard work and success that spurred him on. As the only boy in the home economics group at Rangiora High School when the then owner of Rangiora Bakery, late John van Til, came looking for an apprentice Dean was chosen by default.

During the early days of apprenticeship he lived with his grandmother, Nana Smith, in Rangiora and worked 16-hour days as he learnt his trade. He captained the New Zealand Baking Team to victory for Trans-Tasman Baking Trophy in 1987 and in 1988 was New Zealand Baking Apprentice of the Year – amongst many other awards. It was the sense of pride and satisfaction in his skills that rewarded him – and set him up for the future.

Meanwhile his Dutch father and a grandmother who sent gifts from Holland at Christmas gave him an interest in the

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world beyond North Canterbury. "It was an intrigue. I was certainly aware that I had another culture in my life," says Dean.

At 20 he headed overseas using money his parents had offered him in lieu of a 21st birthday party. He gained experience, worked in the





UK, met his future wife and moved back to New Zealand.

There followed a career that saw him buy and sell his own bakery in Dunedin, start writing his own baking books, work for a variety of corporates and spend several years in the dynamic city of Shanghai. There was no such thing as regular hours but he enjoyed the adrenalin of it and

But nobody gets to work on this basis without sacrifices and Dean has stacked up two divorces and moved around so much he seems to lack roots. He feels more European he says but business is in Singapore, for now. He has friends and family in New Zealand. His son is in London.

It's something he seems aware of but also pragmatic about. Money cannot buy happiness he is clear, but it can buy security and freedom and choice.

"I was building financial freedom and that comes at a cost...I live on my own. I spend 99% of my time on my own. I make a lot of business decisions on my own,"

But he's on good terms with his first wife and has a strong relationship with his son, Jason, 24. When Dean's first marriage broke up Jason opted to stay in Shanghai with his father for a year. It was a year that cemented their relationship says Dean. And he has put a focus on maintaining that ever since.

So what next? Well he's 'semi-retired' he says. He doesn't bake anymore but he does teach occasionally. He loves



cycling and travelling and is a Netflix junkie who's been bingeing on Sons of Anarchy.

But he also likes people and is well experienced in television work having appeared as a judge on NZ's Hottest Home Baker way back in 2011. Since then he's done several television shows including most recently. The Great Kiwi Bake Off.

One of the projects he is enthusiastic about is that he has recently acquired the Singapore rights to The Great Singapore Bake Off from the BBC. "It means I own the format here and I just need to work with the TV networks to produce it," he explains.

Embarking on producing a television series sounds like exactly the sort of semi-retirement that you'd expect from this high energy entrepreneur.

Chicken Pesto Filo Parcels

This month's recipe is from Our Little Garden Recipe Collection, Chicken Pesto Filo Parcels. This recipe is full of fresh flavours and is certainly easy to make and it will certainly impress your hungry dinner guests.

A couple of pointers to make your job easier, if you are pushed for time you can use one or our readymade Pesto's available in the chilled dairy section of our store. Keep an eye on the parcels as they can easily burn especially if you are reheating them up later and if you don't have any spinach you can substitute silver beet.

Ingredients (Serves 4)

- 3 cups fresh basil
- 1/4 cup pistachios, deshelled!
- 1 Tbsp. vinegar or lemon juice
- 1 clove garlic, peeled
- 1/3 cup Pams Cold Pressed Extra Virgin Olive Oil plus extra for brushing
- 2 cups chopped cooked chicken
- 100g ricotta cheese
- 2 cups spinach, roughly chopped
- 8 rectangular sheets filo pastry
- Green salad to serve

Prep time 30 mins Cook time: 20 mins

- In a food processor, blend the basil, pistachios, vinegar, garlic and olive oil until smooth. Season to taste with salt and pepper, then place 1/3 cup into a large mixing bowl and set the rest aside.
- Preheat your oven to 200 degrees Celsius fan bake. To the mixing bowl, add the cooked chicken, ricotta and spinach. Mix well to combine, then season to taste with salt and pepper.
- Take one sheet of filo and brush it lightly with olive oil. Top with another file sheet, then fold in half lengthways. Spoon ¼ of the chicken mixture into the centre of the filo rectangle, and use your hands to bring together into a money/parcel shape.
- Place onto a lined baking tray, and repeat with the remaining pastry and chicken filling. Once all four parcels are made, place into the oven and bake for 15-20 minutes or until the parcels are golden brown and crisp.
- Serve the parcels alongside the remaining pesto and side salad of your choice.



CITRUS on my mind

With an abundance of Lemons about and with Christmas just around the corner it seems timely that my first story with Essence be about (Booze) and making the most of Lemons.

LIMONCELLO

This is an incredibly easy recipe, and I can tell you it will put a smile on the face of anyone who samples it. This makes a

- A good bag full of ripe juicy ripe Lemons 20 30
- 2 bottles of vodka
- 4 cups of water
- Juice from all the lemons
- 2-3 cups of sugar.
- 2 3 large bottles (you can use the vodka bottles) or if you are like me you may have some empty wine bottles.
- 1. Peel the yellow skins, avoiding the pith
- 2. Place peel, lemon juice, water in a pot, add sugar and heat to dissolve sugar, then allow to cool.
- 3. Add vodka and mix, pour into bottles, place in a dark cupboard (hide it from yourself)
- 4. The colour will start to change from cloudy to bright yellow once ready. Allow 6 to 9 weeks. This recipe was adapted to suit my taste.

Top Tips for Citrus:

- Full sun, the hotter the better, nestle them up close to the house, wine barrels make great containers for Citrus.
- Protect from frost
- Feed twice a year with citrus fertiliser once now and again in autumn. Avoid using Epsom Salts too often
- Water deeply once a week from now until Autumn, half a bucket of water once a week will do it
- Prune to allow air movement through the plant, this aids in fruit production and helps prevent a build-up of black sooty mould

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

THE Colourful COLLECTOR

Step into the entrance hall of this award-winning renovation and you're greeted with an eclectic riot of colours and objects.

There's a neat row of miniature Dutch pottery buildings in blue and white – they are given to business travellers on Dutch airline KLM. There's a glorious red and gold camel standing on the corner and a collection of old-style kettles climb the staircase.

With a lifetime spent travelling overseas and 30 years living in the United States, this space houses the memories and the intriguing objects that Stella Robinson has collected over the years.

Stella moved into this home with her husband, Ashley some twenty years ago. At the time they were still to-ing and fro-ing between their life in the US, where Ashley was a professor in public health and veterinary science at the University of Minnesota, and life back here in their native New Zealand. But this didn't stop them embarking on a full-scale renovation of the house. It's a renovation that won awards – and not surprisingly.

The double-storey home is light and bright with the rich tones of rimu on door and window frames. In the living room a rimu clad ceiling is punctured by four skylights where sunshine pours in by the fireplace. Glass doors lead through to the open plan kitchen and a dining

area where beams soar skywards above the dinner table into a dome ceiling.

In the adjoining lounge area a vaulted ceiling is marked by rimu cross beams and a large picture window that looks over a garden swaying with spring colour. It's in clear view from all the living areas and pale blossoms jostle for attention with pastel pink magnolias and vibrant coloured rhodos. The garden is very much part of this house with its light, bright aspect.

"I've always been interested in interiors and designs," says Stella. But she's also not afraid of hard work – she did all the oiling of every piece of rimu in this home herself she says and still mows the lawns herself in the 5-acre garden.

The light, bright space provides the perfect backdrop for the unique and unusual things she has brought back from as far afield as Thailand and Palestine.

"I loved shopping at the markets and the souks," recalls Stella. "I would often go off there when Ashley was working and I loved looking at all the bits and pieces." Her finds include some beautiful glass painted balls from Amman in Jordan and a set of elephants of varying sizes – opium weights from Thailand.

It's a renovation that won awards - and not surprisingly.

But there's a clear kiwi influence here too. And somehow the two worlds blend seamlessly. Some Beatrix Potter figurines stand on a painted, wooden shelf from

On one wall there is a photograph of a group of young ladies in Palestinian national dress.

"It was on the wall in a hotel we stayed at in Ramallah," says Stella. "Ashley asked the hotel manager where we could get one and he just took it off the wall and gave it to us."

On an adjoining wall is a very kiwi water painting of the archetypal rural red shed. After spending 30 years in the US

however, Stella has found it hard in some ways to leave her life there behind entirely. Her daughter, currently recovering from Covid, remains living in Minnesota with her own family and Stella also misses friends she has left behind. And she confesses to being transfixed by the unfolding dramas of US politics spending much of her time watching CNN in the peaceful, bright lounge area.

"It's the same language but a different culture. I do miss my friends," she says, reflecting on her time overseas. But she has made new friends and reconnected with old ones back in North Canterbury.

"I think I just fit in wherever I am", she says.

Planning The Outdoor Room

When it comes to summer most of us want to make the most of our outdoor space – whether that's an unruly bit of grass or an expansive deck. So how do you get started?

"Think about what you actually like," says Dan. "A lot of people I see really struggle

with visualising." To help overcome this he recommends collecting images of outdoor spaces or things you like on your phone and then scrolling through your gallery whilst holding the phone up to your garden space.


Look at the space in real life and take note of how the natural elements affect it. There's no point in creating an outdoor dining space where prevailing winds are going to whip away your paper plates unless you've got some plans to block out the wind. Whether you block it out with modern glass panels or sturdy trellis covered in lush climbing green is up to your personal taste.

And, of course, you're going to need some flat ground to work with before you start laying out decks or tiles or courtyards. Typically you will want three main spaces in the outdoor area. One for eating with a table and seats; one for relaxing with comfy chairs or outdoor couches and one for cooking – where you will probably have your barbecue.

It's important to have a space either around the barbecue or nearby where people can stand says Dan, "blokes like standing around with a beer in hand while one of them cooks". With some idea of the style you want it also helps to mark out the areas of your outdoor space, you can use stakes and string or marking spray paint - it's another great way to visualise your ideas before you start building.

"With decks people often think they don't need as much space," says Dan. "But when they're built they never think they are too big."

Think about your budget and your priorities. If you want a small cosy space cascading with greenery you may want to spend up on plants first – get feature trees in as soon as possible

maintenance as wood furnishings. "You can leave these outside year in and year out and they still look good," says Shane Kirwan, of In Situ GRC, who advises customers on creating outdoor kitchens featuring a special form of concrete that is both stronger and lighter than the traditional. It can be used for everything from tables to countertops and outdoor fire-places.

And again, get back to basics with planning says Shane. "Think about how many people you might want to seat in your outdoor room and think about what you want to cook on." Shane helps people design areas that incorporate anything from basic barbecues to full on kitchens with under bench fridges. pizza ovens and all manner of cooking facilities from smokers to braai – the choices are endless. "The barbecue is usually a social point for guys so make sure it's not facing a wall." advises Shane.

If you already have an outdoor spot but just want to give it a revamp then there are plenty of ways to get inspired. Try some new outdoor chairs - at the time of writing you can pick up some gorgeous retro rattan on TradeMe for a song. Repurpose old items - large wooden cable reels can make great outdoor drinks tables for instance. Grab some cheap and cheerful accessories to colour up a small drab space – you could throw down some fake turf on a dull concrete patch and invest in a couple of colourful deckchairs. Or keep an eye out for fabulous aged plant pots of all shapes and sizes that can be stuffed with lush greens and pops of colour.



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
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
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Hard to believe this garden was just gorse and broom 7 years ago when the owners brought the property after losing their house in the earthquakes.





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
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
