





chance to pick up some truly unique gifts including toys, outdoor ornaments, clothing and more, all from clever and talented makers.



Repeated exposure to UltraViolet radiation (UV) from the sun may lead to skin cancer as well as photodamage: wrinkles, dark spots and fine lines. Both UV-A and UV-B rays are involved in this and UV-B is mostly responsible for redness and skin cancers whereas UV-A rays penetrate into the deeper skin and contribute to fine lines and wrinkles. The amount of UV-A and UV-B that reaches the earth's surface depends on the season but in New Zealand, even in the winter months, our UV exposure is higher than most countries in the world.

Sunscreens can be either physical (these stay as a protective layer on top of the skin, water resistant, need to be reapplied every 80mins, don't penetrate the skin so are usually tolerated by all) or chemical sunscreens (these have higher protection against UV, last longer on the skin and don't leave white marks behind). Sun Protection Factor (SPF) tells you how much UV your skin can handle, e.g SPF 15 means you can handle x15 times more UV than compared with bare skin. In general SPF 30 or more is best for the face.

'Broad spectrum' refers to the range of UV light that the sunscreen offers protection from, and most sunscreens in NZ are in this category. Some suncreens offer protection

Summer Skin Protection

from High Energy Visible light (HEV) which is a very penetrative light that is all around us day and night. We are subjected to it when we use our computers, smartphones, tablets, lighting and other digital electronics. Using a sunscreen on your face with HEV protection is also in your best interest. Zinc and Titanium oxide are found in some sunscreens and these offer protection against Blue light (common source is screens) and this helps reduce dark pigmentation developing in your skin. Interestingly adding a blue light filter to glasses (slight yellowish tinge to the lenses) has been shown to reduce dark pigmentation by blocking melanin pathways in the brain.

While a tan may look good, it comes at a cost to your skin - each tan represents some irreversible damage to your skin which often shows up later in life as dark spots, wrinkles or even skin cancer. While for some of us this seems like a risk worth taking – it is important to take that risk with eyes wide open.

Being a 'flexitarian' when it comes to your health? WORDS: DR LIBBY WEAVER

Have you noticed that every possible way of eating has a label now? While it's fantastic to see more people taking an active interest in their wellbeing, these labels often come with strict rules. This set of criteria around what's acceptable and what's not may work for some, yet for others it simply isn't sustainable.

When people ask me what to eat, I will often encourage them to explore what I fondly call 'flexitarian eating'. This is all about listening to what will best serve your body, health, energy (note: this does not mean tastebuds rule the choice!), and even your spiritual practice. The concept of being a 'flexitarian' can be used by anyone. It simply means you don't have stringent rules.

You might approach your nourishment with the idea that you have high standards. In other words, you don't avoid that highly processed, sugar and preservative laden snack because someone told you not to. Instead, you don't eat it because it doesn't serve your health or quality of life. In saying that, please always remember that it is what you mostly do that impacts your health, not what you do occasionally. Feeling guilty about the odd poor quality food choice does nothing for your health either.

Another flexible approach is what some like to call "zig and zag". A "zig" meal is made up of nutrient-dense foods and no alcohol. While a "zag" meal focuses more on the company you are in, being playful and relaxing. Zags are part of a healthy and sustainable lifestyle. If this approach is going to serve someone's health, I would guide them to zag once a week, or for three out of their 35 eating occasions in a week. For others, five zag occasions better suits them. That's still 30 meals that are high quality nutritionally!

If you know you are going to your office party, or friend's birthday – that doesn't mean the whole day is a write off, yet so many people approach their life or health in this way! This also tends to ramp up over the Christmas and summer holidays period. With the increase in festivities, many people seem to throw nourishing choices out the window until all the celebrations are over and the new year's resolutions kick in. Going to your festive celebrations is even more reason to eat a nutritious breakfast and lunch and to follow up with nutrientdense food choices the next day. You enjoy the zag, but when you live mostly as a zig, the zag takes very little toll on your overall wellbeina.

The way you take care of yourself needs to be sustainable. When you are kinder to yourself and put less pressure on fulfilling set criteria, you are more likely to make choices in your life that you can maintain. So, if following rules feels like deprivation to you, or if you are just looking for a more sustainable approach to how you eat, give flexitarianism a try.









CHRISTMAS BUNTING WITH EMILY FROM THE FABRIC OF SOCIET

YOU WILL NEED... Fabric - white linen is great Paint - Chalk Paint® Emperor's Silk Stencil of choice Masking tape

Roller - microfibre Fabric scissors Sewing machine or needle and thread. Tape, ribbon string...



Step 2 Place stencil over top of fabric. The secret is not to have too much paint on your roller, as too much will cause bleeding underneath your stencil. Tape off your stencil so you don't accidentally add extra marks to your fabric. Carefully lift stencil and place fabric somewhere safe to dry. You can iron on the wrong side to seal if you wish. (I didn't) Alternatively you could cut out letters in a contrasting fabric and sew onto the squares.



Step 4 Hang up your bunting. You may want to hang it across a window, fireplace, doorway or even in the porch. Enjoy your handiwork.. Merry Christmas!





Building the Bank **Back Better**

The old brick BNZ building has finally come back to life in Kaiapoi. The project has taken roughly two years to complete and has been a real challenge according to Kaiapoi developer Jedd Pearce.

"Most people don't want to do restorations as you end up spending more than it's worth," says Jedd. But whilst it may not be a money maker, preserving such a building creates an important and positive legacy – one that really matters to the North Canterbury community.

"I wanted to do something for Kaiapoi, to help out the town," says Jedd, whose family have lived in the area for three generations. But he is quick to point out, this was never a one man show. Local business Hazeldine Construction did all the building work,

Paper Plus took on the lease, a local interior designer Katy Husband from, Feather & Oak Interiors, finished the apartments on the upper levels.

It's a thought echoed by Jasmine Hazeldine. "At the opening we were talking to people about what has gone in Kaiapoi, and buildings that our kids will never see. This restoration been a real team effort and I'm so proud for Kaiapoi."

severely damaged and was bought by North Canterbury businessman John Shivas in 2015, his intention was to save it from demolition. He commenced restoration and strengthening work on it, but sadly passed away before he was able to complete it and the building was then sold.

CHALLENGES

There were plenty of challenges in the restoration including surprises. Like the three internal ceilings that Pearce says may have been intended to try and make the downstairs room warmer.

"We were lucky too," says Jedd. "As local builders Hazeldine came on board and did the work at cost for us."

To strengthen the building the Hazeldine team drilled eight metres down through the brick walls to the foundation, inserted threaded rod and anchored this to the foundation. The interior was gutted to install a steel structure at midfloor level and diaphragm midfloor was created. A steel angle was then installed to the second storey ceiling line to form a diaphragm ceiling.

The fireplaces were removed, restored and reinstated. The windows were removed, reglazed, new sash weights were put on them and they were reinstalled. And after looking at old photos the team realised the building had had three chimneys on the roof - so they rebuilt them.

Nasturtium

The Sport that Saves lives

Your local surf lifesaving club has a sports arm, facilitating fit fast lifeguards, on hand to help you when you need it. Can you help them?

It's 6pm on a Monday in November. A cold easterly is gaining strength at Waikuku Beach.

Dog walkers move briskly, donning thick jackets, their hair whipped into giant knots.

Adults and children, some as young as ten, are lined up on the water's edge, their yellow fluoro vests prominent along the foreshore. Split into coaching groups they will cover age-based skills, endurance. speed, and strategy between October and March.

Tonight, the seniors are swimming with Gary. They don't wear wetsuits at swimming practice. They are encouraged to feel the water - to know when to change from high knees to duck diving to swimming using all their senses. They are encouraged to train as they would race – faces into the water and their best efforts, despite the frigid water.

It's a certain type of person who wants to do this, but all of them are part of your local lifeguard team or those who hope to when they are old enough.

In a rescue or a race, you don't dictate the conditions or the weather. You must learn to embrace the good and the bad and do the best you can. Resilience and determination are two of many traits that these lifeguards, and lifeguards-in-waiting possess.

Meanwhile, the juniors grab their kneeboards – a type of board you lie on or kneel to use - and sprint into the choppy sea. Few hesitate, most just want to get out there and catch a wave. The water becomes a technicolour assault on the eyes - bright boards all vying to get out behind the breaking surf. Lifeguards and parents monitor, the coaches direct, and the kids look out for each other.

Somebody loses a board and the unmanned craft washes into shore. A training buddy sees it as a good opportunity to practice a board rescue and picks their mate up. They get on a wave together and it's grins all-round until a rogue wave from the easterly chop catches them unaware. Their weight distribution is not adjusted in time and the passengers lose their board, but not their grins.

The seniors head back out, this time with their knee boards or surf skis. They are working on entering and leaving the water - an area the athletes themselves recognise needs more work.

At the end of the session, they rinse off their surf craft and battles ensue for hot showers at the clubhouse. Parents grab a hot drink once everyone is out of the water and accounted for. Tired figures head home only to do it again Wednesday night, Saturday, and sometimes Sunday.

Nurturing future lifeguards through surf sport requires volunteers and funding to support the club, its craft, craft maintenance and replacement, specialist coaching, and administration.
