

## A new destination playground is coming to South Canterbury!

Play is one of the most important things that we can do. Now that the play equipment at Caroline Bay, Timaru needs replacing, it's time to break from traditional playgrounds and offer more stimulating and inclusive play for all ages and abilities. We all want a fun, challenging playground where our kids can follow their imagination, play as their creativity takes them and not leave anyone out. The new playground can help our health, foster development and movement, promote social skills, resilience and tolerance. And help us connect to our special stories, heritage and history.

Soon you will be able to play on a shipwreck, lighthouse, 50m tandem flying fox, with a lava obstacle challenge floor, under 5s space, as well as over 40 play pieces themed around our environment and local stories. This will be a destination playground for locals and visitors to inspire us to move and play for a healthier and happier community.

This project is being managed by a joint steering group with CPlay volunteers and TDC to ensure every aspect of the finance, planning and build is well considered and organized. Aoraki Foundation are supporting the team by managing donations so you can claim 33%

# Suri Meares A Hat for Every Occasion

Susi has always loved hats! She grew up on a farm at Bluecliffs with a very creative mother and father, so as a child was always making things. She says she owes her sense of creativity to her mother, Odette and her father Gerry. Gerry was always making things in the workshop and Odette was often arranging flowers or creating something exciting.

She started making hats at 24 when she couldn't find a hat for herself that she liked. This initial creation led to commission jobs, where she takes orders for her exquisite custom-made hats, head pieces and

Susi loves the fact that people are becoming more adventurous with their choices and that she is able to bring interesting embellishments onto her creations such as feathers or flowers. On one occasion she even used a bright pink flamingo nestled into a massive nest of feathers! Men are also starting to reach out to her to design

a specific colour that becomes the baseline for the

headwear for them. One such example was race-goer Michael Stanton who wanted a design to show that men can also wear a headpiece while retaining their masculinity. The piece used black felt with six black guills that swept across the face and the Press cleverly named it the 'Man-inator'!

> Her business name of Seventh and Figg was chosen when she was travelling in New York in her early twenties. Susi saw the names together on the corner of Seventh and Figg Streets and so the sophisticated and elegant brand was born. She now supplies hats for World, an avante-garde fashion store in Auckland and also for Bridget Hope at Magpie Style in Rangiora. Susi feels she is very lucky to be able to work with creative and compatible designers, such as Frances Hooper at World and Bridget Hope who give her free reign. She can be as way-out and flamboyant as she wants and she has built up a loyal client base through these two outlets. Philip Treacy, who designs

hats for royalty is also a source of inspiration for Susi. However, Susi designs and makes each hat herself. She said "It's always rewarding for me to know that my hats are being loved and admired at races and weddings". So, if you are going to a wedding or the races or to any special occasion, then Susi is the person to see. She has a broad repertoire from classic timepieces to dramatic avante-garde creations. We have predominantly used social media and marketing emails to grow to where we are today and hope that this continues, we sure think it will once our label gets launched!"






With the increase of online shopping a big part of Paulette's job is altering gowns that have been purchased online.

"The kids are having a ball. There is so much more room for them to run around, and they had some input into how their rooms were styled."



Another key feature of the Fraser's new home is the cladding, which was sourced from North Island company The Redwood Guys, Ben said.

"We used redwood for the cladding which is a New Zealand timber grown in the North Island."

"While the build itself was relatively stress-free during the project, 37-year-old Mhairi was diagnosed with breast cancer," Ben said.

"It was a struggle because she was traveling to Timaru for treatment but in a way the build helped her take her mind off the cancer which she really appreciated. The treatment couldn't have gone better to be honest because it saved her life."

While Mhairi continues to recuperate, the couple are now looking toward their next project: landscaping their garden.





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

Glyn is the creative force behind Albury Forge, a bespoke metalwork business making knives, furniture, boot racks and other household items, located in the beautiful Mackenzie district.

Since 2015, Glyn's range of products have been sold at Fairlie giftware and interiors store Matilda and The Metalman. Owned by his wife Luisa Potter, Glyn is the Metalman to Luisa's Matilda. A boiler maker by trade with a passion for metalwork, up until recently Glyn worked in the Australian mining industry as an emergency services officer. However,


after becoming stuck across the Tasman due to Covid 19 restrictions, Glyn decided to give up his job, return to Albury and become the village's resident metal

"When I was stranded in Australia, I was trying to think what I could do when I got home. I have always wanted to do this, but I have never had the courage to say that's it, I'm going to give up my job and make a living through


