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
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Open Day at Harlau House a Success



of Rallying




Holding her nerve barrelling along at 190 km per hour, excellent concentration, accurate time management and organisational skills, as well as having good neck strength (as the rallies are spent looking down at pace notes in her lap) are all attributes Sam Gray has in spades. Not to mention sheer guts as the car skids on shingle, slides off the road on black ice, rolls down a bank or spins into a tree stump – all in a day's rallying for this petite blonde 24 year old co-driver.

Rallying is in Sam's blood. Her grandfather competed, and her parents, Sonya and Steve Gray met through rallying and competed together. Sam remembers watching them rallying when she was a pre-schooler, but t wasn't until she was twenty and in her second year of her B.Ag Sci at Lincoln University, after standing on the side-line at Otago Rally in 2015, that she decided she wanted to give rallying a go.

And what remarkable strides she has made in the sport. A couple of months after watching the Otago Rally, Sam got her motorsport licence and started competing, never dreaming that one day she would be sitting in a rally car alongside Hayden Paddon. A friend of her parents, Barry Varcoe, needed a co-driver and so her rallying path was set. Her first start was in 2015 at the Catlins Coast Rally where they had not one but two crashes and unfortunately did not finish, but n the 2015 Spring Rally held in the Kakahu Forest nea

Geraldine, Sam and David Quantock had finished third in their class and sixth overall. She then teamed up with Keith Anderson and their first rallies were a chapter of mechanical gremlins – in the 2016 Mainland Rally Series they had an engine blow up, then a tyre rod arm bent, and the radiator hose broke, all within the first three rallies together. But none of these incidents deterred Sam from continuing to compete and Keith and Sam had a brilliant finish to the season with two first in class









finishes and finished 3rd overall for the

In the past three years, Sam has certainly made an impression on the sport. She was selected for two national academies in 2017. The first, the Motorsport New Zealand Elite Motorsport Academy takes eight drivers or co-drivers from all four-wheeled motorsport events in New Zealand and teaches them "everything outside the car". She was then chosen for the first Rally NZ Elite Co-drivers Academy, to develop top level navigators. Since then Sam has paired up with Regan Ross to drive in the New Zealand rally championship in a classic Ford Escort RS1800. Last year they won the International Otago Classic Rally and Sam took out the historic co-driver's championship for the New Zealand Rally



to take a test ride alongside Hayden, to

see if she was on the right track by calling the pace notes at his rally pace. Hyundai New Zealand along with Pinnacle Program presented Sam with the chance to co-drive with Hayden in the Rally of Whangarei in May this year, which they won by over 4 minutes to their closest competitor. She had to be super-prepared, getting every single intricate detail of the course written down. This involves drivers and co-drivers going out onto the course for a reconnaissance or 'recce' the day before the event and writing down all the course details. These are refined at night and translated into her own language. There is no room for error! Sam relished this opportunity to compete at this level and was lucky enough to be offered another rally sitting with Hayden, at her local national rally, Rally of South Canterbury,

Liz and I were sent to cover the story of Hayden Paddon's new racing car for Essence. Little did I think that this innocent evening would result in my lucky number seven being chosen for a spin with him in his rally car!

Then the panic set in! What if I get motion sickness? How embarrassing would that be! The Sunday for my ride arrived and it was a stunning sunny winter's day. My emotions were a mixture of excitement and anxiety. The venue was just outside Geraldine and there was Hayden's s racing support truck with the gazebo alongside, where the support team work their magic to make sure that the car is always mechanically safe, including tyres being changed after every five trips.

After signing all the paperwork and being briefed on what to do, I was fitted into a flash Hyundai branded racing suit and helmet. By now my heart was beating furiously. What had I let myself in for? Samantha strapped me into my harness and Hayden asked if I was ready. I trusted his driving skills but was I emotionally ready?

We slowly pulled onto the road and then turned left onto the track. Hayden gave me the thumbs up confirming that I was ready. I grabbed my harness with both hands and we were off. 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



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Dare to be different

Be prepared

We can't predict natural disasters, but we can prepare for them. One of the best places to start is with your home.

In most emergencies you should be able to stay in your home. You should plan to be able to look after yourself and those in your household for at least three days or more. Consider the following for keeping as a basic emergency supply kit:

- At least 3 days of water (9L for each person). You can use old fizzy drink and juice bottles, but milk bottles are a no-go as residual bacteria can infect the water. If you're storing tap water from a mains supply treated with chlorine, you don't normally need to add anything to the water.
- · Long-lasting food that doesn't need cooking, at least enough to sustain each member of the household for 72 hours. Also include food for babies and pets.
- Toilet paper and large plastic buckets to fashion an emergency toilet.
- Dust masks and work gloves.

It suggests you have the following items in a getaway bag in the event of a quick evacuation:

- Radio
- Spare batteries Hand sanitiser
- Cash
- Photo ID and other important documents
- Walking shoes
- Warm clothes
- · First aid kit and any prescription medicine
- Water and snack food
- Medication

The most important thing is having a conversation and making a basic plan with your family. This just means sitting around the table one night and jotting down a few quick who can help you and who might need your help," she says. "You don't have to have all your supplies in one place, but you might need to find them in a hurry and/or in the dark.



Powercuts



Power outages can be unplanned and sudden, causing disruption for the whole community and the local economy.

Depending on the severity of the event, it can range from hours to days before the lights are back on. In a natural disaster. it might be weeks before power can be restored safely

There are ways to minimise the impact of an extended unplanned outage. For example, you can use a BBQ for cooking, have a torch in a place where it's quickly found, keep freezers and refrigerators closed and have a battery-operated radio with plenty of spare batteries.

You should also turn-off or disconnect appliances, electronics and sensitive equipment to prevent damage as the power may surge and spike when it comes

An alternative power source to run lights and household appliances is a generator, these should be placed outdoors due to the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning from the

It is essential that a proper generator fitting is used, and never connect loads which exceed the generator's maximum output rating.

If you don't have a generator, consider going to an alternative location which has power, but only if it is safe to do so.

As there is no warning when the power may come back on always treat lines and

The sleepy village inevitably faces disruption, however, when the florist Narcisse dies, bequeathing some land to Rosette, the strawberry thief, and a confession to the priest, Reynaud, that has ramifications for many. With the arrival of a charismatic new woman, Morgane Dubois, who opens a mysterious tattoo shop, Vianne faces a threat that unsettles her and forces her to call upon the talents she has worked so hard to disguise in the interest of a peaceful existence.

Mysticism and mystery abound in this book which focuses on the conflicts within families. Harris writes sensitively about the precarious bond between mothers and children. The wind is a constant presence, signaling both change and the threat of danger. This is a wonderful whimsical winter read!



Reduce food waste by planning a menu and writing a shopping list. This way you are more likely to eat everything you buy and you will know which bags and containers to take shopping with you. Any food scraps that you do end up with need to be fed to animals or composted.

Reduce food packaging by taking containers and jars to collect meat, fish, cheese and small goods from the butcher and delicatessen. Take cloth bags to collect bread from the baker, and find stores that sell staples like flour, sugar, rice, and nuts from bulk food bins so you can use your own bags.

Avoid as much plastic as possible.
Buy or make reusable food covers, store food in glass jars or stainless steel containers, and choose compostable cleaning cloths and scrubs that can go in your compost when you are done with them.

Simple, natural cleaning products like soap, vinegar and bicarb soda can be used effectively everywhere in the kitchen. You can also buy detergents from bulk and health food stores using your own reusable bottles.

Grow your own food (herbs are a good place to start) and choose local, seasonal and ethically produced food.

The Good Green Bin

Save money! Save waste! And save the planet! It's a win-win when you use your good green bin.

The Timaru District Council's 3-2-1- ZERO New Zealand leading three-bin kerbside collection system was introduced to divert 75% of household waste from landfill, with over 50% of that being organics! At the same time, a composting facility was constructed to process the organic waste from the green bin collection, transfer stations and commercial sources. Keep your good green bin happy by putting in all your garden waste, food waste, soiled paper and shredded paper.

Drop in your slops and bin your bones, fats, fish and flowersit all adds power to the compost we make. Put in food loose or food in paper, or buy a Council bio-bin to put it all in. The variety of organic material received contributes to making our wonderful Timaru Eco-compost, which can be used to rebuild the health of the soil and yields stunning results. This superfood increases the nutritive soil value, the yield and the water retention capability, as well as the diversity of the little creatures in the soil. Just remember that healthy soil =healthy food = healthy people (Oranga ruku= Oranga kai = Oranga tangata)

While carbon dioxide is typically painted as the bad boy of greenhouse gases, methane is roughly thirty times more



potent as a heat-trapping gas. Methane is emitted by the decay of organic waste in landfills, so putting all forms of compostable material and organic waste into our green bins

is an easy way for us all to contribute towards reducing the

effects of climate change.

There are 20,000+ green bins in the Timaru District, largely in urban areas. Each kerbside collection for green waste ranges from 600-800 green bins per day, depending on urban density and distance to travel. Timaru District Council Waste Minimisation Manager Ruth Clarke says that you can purchase bio-bins and compostable liners from the Timaru District Council or the Crow's Nest. Council has approved these compostable liners to make sure that they are able to be processed in our facility. They are also printed with handy hints for what you can put in your green bin.

When you put food waste into your green bin, look at it carefully - is it really waste or is it something you could have eaten? Check out the Love Food Hate Waste website www. lovefoodhatewaste.co.nz for some staggering statistics on how much food New Zealanders waste, eg 20 million loaves of bread per year, as well as handy hints and tips on how to change this behaviour and save yourself some hard earned cash.

We can all do our bit to reduce waste to landfill, restrict greenhouse gas emissions and to feed our gardens by using our good green bins effectively and then buy the compost. Why wouldn't you do it? And enjoy a good old-fashioned bread-and-butter pudding at the same time!

Timaru District Council - Zero Waste Events

As a Zero Waste Council, the Timaru District Council helps event organisers provide a successful waste management plan for events within the Timaru District and provides a significant level of assistance to groups planning public events.

A Zero Waste Event is not merely providing composting and recycling services at the event, but with careful planning, ensuring that no residual waste is generated. By holding a Zero Waste Event, you will minimise the disposal of valuable materials to landfill and increase the amount of compostable and recyclable material recovered.

By good planning at the early stages to ensure that all materials to be discarded are reusable, recyclable or compostable, waste bins should not be needed. This is the goal.

With this goal in mind, the Council provides assistance to event organisers to ensure that waste materials generated at their events are recovered for composting and recycling.

The Timaru District Council is a Zero Waste Council and is committed to reducing, re-using, recycling and composting waste materials.

Foodbank Canterbury

The Green Solution to Hunger

Foodbank Canterbury was founded by John and Janice Milligan in 2015. It is the only independent secular organisation in Christchurch that links the food industry to community groups. And now it is coming to Timaru.

Foodbank wants to keep food products out of our landfills. New Zealand is not a good country with respect to food waste. In fact we are ninth on the OECD list for food waste. John and Janice returned to NZ in 2015 after a long stint working for the not-for-profit sector in America. They realised that food waste is a growing social, environmental and economic problem in this country, so they decided to do something about it.

Foodbank Canterbury's mission is "to collect as much food as we can and to get it to the people who need it most as effectively as possible." Their first pick-up was fifteen sandwiches from a café in Christchurch three years ago and this has now grown to two tonnes of food rescued a day. The food is collected from supermarkets and other food producers. It is quality surplus food – such as from bent tins, ripped packets or products nearly at their use-by date. For food safety reasons no opened food is collected. 90% of the food collected is cleared within 24 hours. It is sorted and turned over to charities such as the City Mission, Salvation Army, St Vinnies, Family Works, Presbyterian Support

Presbyterian Support and Women's Refuges, who then distribute it directly to disadvantaged and at risk families and to individuals that they support.

has been co-opted onto the Board. John wanted



knowledge of the community, and Jo was the perfect choice with her past experience as an MP with the Food Safety and Community and Voluntary Service portfolios. Two local coordinators have been appointed – Tracy Dawe and Ingrid Moore.

Last year Foodbank Canterbury was the Supreme Winner: Small Enterprises in the Westpac Business Champions Awards.

John and Janice have been blown away by the phenomenal sense of community in South Canterbury since the idea of the Foodbank Canterbury facility in Timaru was floated The Mid and South Canterbury Trust gave initial funding to secure the building they have leased

> from the Grosvenor Hotel. Pub Charities donated a chiller and Countdown, a chiller van. Local tradesman have generously donated their labour to upgrade the building and local trusts have also chipped in. 


