Alopecia is a topic that is discussed on and off in the Essence office because about five or six years ago, I was unfortunately diagnosed with Frontal Fibrosing Alopecia (FFA) a form of scarring alopecia which is characterised by a slowly progressive band of hair loss along the front and sides of the scalp resulting in a permanent loss around the hairline.

Before my diagnosis alopecia wasn't really something I thought about - when I started noticing my eyebrows thinning, I just put it down to getting older. A few months later I realised the hair on my arms and legs had all but disappeared and I had a slight redness around my forehead. It didn't cross my mind that it might be alopecia.

However, these noticeable changes were enough to make me seek an appointment with my GP who referred me to a dermatologist. I remember my first appointment with the dermatologist who likened FFA to a forest fire he assured me that it would burn out at some stage – hopefully sooner rather than later I thought and I'm quietly confident that's what is going to happen. I have my fingers and toes severely crossed!

In the early days of my diagnosis, I was constantly on Google reading any research there was – but to be honest there wasn't a lot. FFA was only diagnosed in 1994 and there seems to be no known cause or effective treatment but it is said to be increasing worldwide. I was prescribed daily antibiotics and steroids in the hope they would have some effect in halting the progression but in the end, I decided that the negative sideeffects of the drugs and the fact that they were really only experimental at best made me decide that the uncertainty wasn't worth the

risk. I'm happy to wait until more research is done although I do have days when I wonder if I've made the right choice.

I'm fortunate that I have my close friend Michele, owner of Hi Gorgeous, who is able to use her amazing styling skills to disguise my hair loss. Most people don't know unless I tell them. Having a regular relationship with your hairdresser can be more important than you realise – they are often the first to recognise if things are going haywire. Michele has been quite surprised at the level of hair loss she is seeing in clients right now so something odd is going on. A worldwide group that I belong to, are convinced that it could be something in the ingredients of beauty products, skin care or it may be environmental - but who would know - it would be amazing to find out. Other forms of alopecia have been around forever so it's interesting that this is a relatively new' variant

LIVING WITH Alopecia

For Debbie Albrecht, a problem "We have a lot of conversations with women shared is a problem halved.

The well-known Rangiora businesswoman has alopecia areata, an idiopathic disorder characterised by a rapid loss of hair that usually begins on the scalp.

"I started noticing hair loss when I was about 40. I had what is called a subtotal hysterectomy, and I am not sure if it's related but after that I started noticing less hair on my eyebrows, arms, and legs. Then about four years ago I started to get very noticeable patches of hair loss. At first I tried to disguise it, but it came to a point where I couldn't do that anymore.

When she received her diagnosis, the 56-year-old said she took it "very personally"

"There was a period of feeling sorry for myself, but I am not one of those people who will sit on that. I think when you are diagnosed with anything it's like goodness gracious what is this all about? And after that initial shock you say okay what do I need to do? How do I sort this out? And then you get on with it."

"I started wearing a topper which is a partial wig. Then I found out I could have a hair integration system, where they take what hair you have and attach real hair to it. I managed to do that for about six months, but I reacted to the net that they put on your scalp. So about three months ago I had my head shaved completely, and I started wearing a wig. But what has happened now is, and I don't know how long it will last, my hair has started growing back."

After her initial shock, the So You! Boutique owner made the choice to be open about her condition, and has used her experience to help herself and others.

"When I started this journey I did a Facebook video on the So You! page showing my hair loss. And after doing that, for months I had women come into the store and share their story about cancer or alopecia with me."

about what is going on in their lives. My hair loss is nothing compared to what some of these women are going through. For me, the way I have coped with it was to share and it has helped me immensely.

Everyone has their own journey; everyone is different, and everyone copes in different ways. And if you aren't coping that's okay but don't be too hard on yourself, it is going to take time. I think it's important to be kind to yourself, have a supportive network and to talk to other people who have alopecia."

The 56-year-old said a lot of the women who approached her were unaware of their options in regard to wigs and cosmetic treatments

"A lot of them thanked me for sharing my story because they didn't know what their options were. My eyebrows are cosmetic tattoos. I wear evelash extensions sometimes so there are things out there that you can do – there is choice. You can still be nine with no hair!

There are also advantages to hair loss. You don't have to shave your legs or under your arms."

"A number of people also did not know that they could receive financial assistance from the government to purchase a wig or hairpiece", Debbie said.

Called the Wigs and Hairpieces Service Payment, this subsidy is for people who suffer from serious hair loss because of a medical condition, or have undergone treatment for cancer.

"The wigs these days look very real, especially the ones made with real hair. [For my wig] I went to Savanna Hair Solutions in Christchurch. It takes about six to 12 weeks to be made, and when you get the wig you can style it any way you want. You can colour it. You can use heated tongs on it. You can do everything and anything you would do on your own hair. The only thing you can't do is go swimming with it on, and you wouldn't go to sleep with it on."

Initially diagnosed with alopecia areata, at the end of 2017 In addition to her alopecia, the 56-year-old has recently been the mother of two was told that her condition had advanced diagnosed with haemochromatosis, a genetic condition that to alopecia universalis. 'You don't need hair to paddle'. That was the reaction of Marie Childs' Waimak Dragon Boat Club teammates when she

To some that might seem like a strange thing to say, but it was exactly what she needed to hear. You see, Marie has alopecia universalis, an autoimmune condition where the lymphocytes around hair follicles release chemical messengers called cytokines that reject the hair, resulting in 100% hair loss on

"I just felt a cool breeze one day and I put my hand up and thought oh my goodness - that's skin. I didn't think too much of it, and it grew back. Over the next three years I would get another one and it would grow back, then I would get another one and it would grow back. Then I noticed receding around my ears, and a patch on the back of my neck that just kept

"I was devastated by it. There is a big difference in telling people you have no hair, and them actually seeing a totally bald scalp, no eyebrows, no eyelashes. There were moments where I thought I had to quit my job. I can't do dragon boating any more. I just wanted to go and hide."

A turning point for Marie came when she made the decision to be open about her condition with her teammates.

"There was one of the girls on the team who said to me, 'I don't care about your hair as long as you can still paddle'. And they [the rest of the team] were pretty much the same - 'you don't need hair to paddle'. They were interested, and they asked questions, but they didn't judge me. It felt good just to paddle and know that my hair wasn't their priority.

"That was kind of my turning point. I thought I can't be a recluse, it's not in my nature. So, I put a post on Facebook and did this major coming out."

While her teammates are not concerned by her lack of hair, the reaction of strangers can be quite confronting, Marie said.

"I get a lot of sympathetic smiles, and I have people come up to me in the mall because they think I have cancer. There was one guy very early on and he came up and he said, 'my daughter's got the same hairdo as you at the moment'. And I just turned around and said 'I'm not having chemo'. He was very apologetic, and I felt bad, but I was embarrassed. He was just trying to be kind to me. I feel guilty that people feel sorry for me when I'm not actually sick."

Now at the age of 54, Marie has started to make peace with her condition with the help of her family, and counselling.

"Everyone has been very accepting and supportive. My brother and his family have been very supportive, and my mum is amazing. At the start she struggled because she couldn't do anything to help, and as a parent that's really hard. My sons Nathan and Matt have been a tower of strength since the very early days, and my partner Rick continues to be my rock.

Late last year I had a couple of counselling sessions. It's the first time I have had counselling, and spoken about my hair. She said I need to go through a grieving process. Losing my hair and dad dying, I kind of blocked everything out and just got on with it because that's my personality, but it all caught up.

There is certainly a degree of lost identity. Hair can influence how you see yourself, and how others see you, so it becomes an extension of your identity. I used to have long blonde hair, and there are still moments when I really miss it, that's hard.

There are so many people out there with different conditions. I still have two arms, two legs, my brain, I can still do everything I did before, I just look different. When it comes to choosing your condition, I am pretty lucky really."

When asked if she had any advice for others experiencing hair loss, Marie said was important to be open with the people around you

"My best advice would be don't try and hide it. Share it. Be open with it right from the start with people. I couldn't think of anything worse than to be imprisoned by it. The more people who know the more strength you will have. If you don't tell anyone, how can they support you?"

"It's life-changing and it's hard. There are times when you'll feel angry and naturally think why me? But if you want to live your life you've just got to get on with it."

And that's exactly what Marie is doing. When she is not paddling up and down the Kaiapoi River with the Waimak Dragons, Marie coaches the Rangiora High School dragon boat team. From 2019 to 2021, Marie was the president of the Aoraki Dragon Boat Association, and in 2019 she founded the all-women team Pegasus Dragons. In 2021, the Aoraki Dragon Boat Association awarded Marie the prestigious Coach of the Year award

After five years in this job, she was off on her OE. In 2004 Juliana ended up in Bahrain where her uncle was a 747 Captain. While there, she saw an advertisement in the local paper for air hostesses and she was one of five chosen out of 75 applicants. So began her career with Gulf Air where she flew internationally and was also trained as a sky nanny at Norland College in England. Three years later she was chosen as the sole executive flight attendant for NetJets Middle East/ National Air Service. She was on board Gulfstream, Falcon and Hawker private jets and was responsible for setting up the aircraft, catering and in -flight service for the owners and private charter flights. Her clients included members of the Saudi Royal family and their entourage, Ministers and some celebrities such as Roger Federer and Tony Blair. One of the perks of this well -paid job was the one month on and one month off contract, including business class flights home on Emirates into Christchurch every rotation off

Born and bred in Timaru, Juliana was educated at Claremont primary school and completed her secondary education at Craighead. Horses were always important in her life and on leaving school she went to Telford Rural Polytechnic and studied Equine, after which she was asked to return as assistant tutor. She then moved to mid-Canterbury, where she was a stock manager at the

Juliana met Mike, her future English engineer husband in Bahrain. They were married in 2010 at Seven Oaks, which was then owned by her parents. Juliana kept flying and commuting between NZ and Saudi Arabia for another 18 months. She had to have two New Zealand passports - one in her maiden name (because she couldn't reveal that she was married in order to be able to work in Saudi) and the second for personal travel and ease of entering visa waver countries (without certain countries' customs stamps in the passport denying entry).

After nearly ten years of living life at 30,000 feet Juliana returned to South Canterbury to work with her passion for horses and other animals. She was in her second year of studying vet nursing through Otago Polytechnic when she became pregnant with her son Ashley. After having three children, around her 40th birthday her life took a dramatic turn when she was diagnosed with colorectal cancer. After no prior health issues in her lifetime, this mother with three young children aged four, two and just five months old, was suddenly whisked away from her family to spend six weeks staying at Cancer society's Daffodil House in Christchurch and to have intensive radiation and chemotherapy treatment. Following this were three major operations. Mike had to take leave from work to look after their young children and become her full time carer. It was through this experience that Juliana got much needed help from Plunket's Giving People Support Home Visiting Service. Juliana is now the coordinator of this wonderful service. She told me that volunteering and helping families is far more rewarding than any salary, because she knows from first-hand experience that with GPS she is making a positive difference in someone's life.

Juliana is now in remission and her lifestyle is the total opposite of working with the rich and famous in Saudi Arabia. She and Mike and their three children Arabella (3), Amelia(6) and Ashley (8) are happily living on a lifestyle block in Taiko. Whatever direction life has pulled her in she always reminds herself 'Doubt kills more dreams than failure ever will'.

New chapter for

SOUTH CANTERBURY MUSEUM

The South Canterbury Museum is about to head into a significant new chapter of its own history.

Having started in a house on the current site in 1952, the Museum has expanded to have several hundred metres of display space, and three floors of behind-the-scenes collection storage. Now it is planning to shift all of the exhibitions, education area and public programmes spaces to a new site beside the Theatre Royal on Stafford Street.

This new facility, planned to open in early 2024, will provide more space for these public-facing activities, along with much better access and a closer link to historic parts of downtown Timaru. The existing Perth Street building will be redeveloped, housing the Museum's unique collections, and making them accessible for research.

The South Canterbury Museum is a community service provided by the Timaru District Council. It has always been a great place to explore the region's heritage. Locals and visitors can experience aspects of our region's stories, as well as take part in events and public programmes. The Museum is a rich resource for anyone wanting to investigate historical topics or research their family tree.

The Museum's focus is on the natural and cultural heritage of our region – nature, history and culture. Like other parts of New Zealand, our region has its own distinct heritage. This includes our landscape, from towering mountains to the sea, and the wide range of landforms found here. It includes the fossil record; evidence of past lives linked to how the land has changed from being former sea floor to a forested land full of now-extinct moa and many other fascinating creatures.

Our region's human history begins around 900 years ago when settlers from Eastern Polynesia arrived, the first known people to do so. The centuries that followed saw the development of Māori language and culture, with local traditions of settlement, migration and change. The first Europeans to live here were whalers, followed by run holders in the 1850s, with the last 170 years seeing a massive change as thousands of immigrants arrived. transforming the landscape and culture to what we have today.

The Museum's collections and displays tell the stories of our geological past, our unique wildlife, local Māori

heritage, European settlement and how the region has taken shape over the last 150 years. The collection includes several thousand natural history specimens, hundreds of archaeological items representing taoka Māori, and thousands of artefacts, photographs and archival items representing the last 170 years of recorded history. These collections are the raw material for the Museum's programmes of research, exhibition, education, and exploration.

The Museum team work hard to catalogue every item, and ensure that it is kept safe to avoid damage or deterioration. The collections act as a library that can be drawn upon for the Museum's programmes.

One of the prime uses of the Museum's collections is in exhibitions. These tell our region's heritage stories - landscapes, life forms and people. In addition, the Museum currently features a small changing exhibition area that hosts changing displays from both within the Museum's collections and from elsewhere.

A small team of part-time teaching staff at the Museum make up the Heritage Education Service, who develop and facilitate education programmes for local schools. Funded by the Ministry of Education, more than 5,000 students take part in these programmes every year, either in the Museum, at heritage sites or other facilities that link to the Museum's programmes.

The South Canterbury Museum is a place where things happen, and people can be involved. The Friends of the Museum, set up through the Museum's founder the South Canterbury Historical Society, enables members to take part in opening events, historic site trips and to be kept informed of Museum happenings. The Museum holds a range of family events through school holiday times, as well as organising talks and events for general audiences such as the annual retro rock concert outside the Museum The Museum Explorers Club, a free membership club for primary school students, has more than 2,000 members who are rewarded every time they visit the Museum.

The South Canterbury Museum is open Tuesday to Friday from 10am to 4.30pm, and on Saturday, Sunday, and public holidays from 1pm to 4.30pm. For more information, visit the Museum online here www.museum. timaru.govt.nz. You can also follow the South Canterbury Museum on Facebook and Instagram.





So what should we be looking at? First up the simple things, we can overpay for those things that we use all the time power, mobile, broadband. And whilst switching providers does require a bit of admin - it's not difficult.

"It's never been easier to shop around online and there's so much information out there. One thing that's important to know, is that often these comparison sites are sales funnels. So they funnel you towards a given provider but once you know that you can still be armed with the information of who has the best deal," says Hartmann.

It's also worth asking about discounts, he advises. If there's a discounted rate being offered to new customers, why not ask if you can have it? The worse they can do is say no.

Insurance should also be reviewed annually, says Hartmann. Things like contents and car insurance can vary in price and some companies offer a discount if you have more than one policy with them. Whilst with things like life insurance and income protection - the risk you're seeking to mitigate is likely to change over time.

Home loans are another thing to keep an eye on. Whilst most of us just chip away at the mortgage and keep one eye on the glacial pace of decrease, little tweaks can make a big difference in the long term, says Hartmann. This might include things like adding a little extra to your repayments or looking around at rates.

There is plenty of help out there – and it can be worth tapping into that. "Those bigger questions, planning for retirement, mortgages, investing for specific goals, insurances....all those have become both complex but highly configurable," says Hartmann.

A good financial adviser can really help you make sure that things are set up properly for your goals.

It's not just what you're spending that needs a regular review, but what you're saving too. If you're putting money aside for a specific goal, your kid's education or a first home deposit then you want that money to work as hard as it can for you. This also applies to your KiwiSaver, says Hartmann, be aware of things like management fees which can vary between providers

Ultimately, we are creatures of habit, says Hartmann and this shows in our money as much as other areas of our lives. We spend at the same coffee shop or on the same apps time and again. "Everybody likes their routine but we get into habits that have us spending money in certain ways, so it's really good to check in." says Hartmann. "There are very real long term implications."





The wetlands also feature an ancient basalt lava rock wall from the flow from Mt Horrible.

For a front-row view of the area's stunning fauna and flora, the Otipua Wetlands Walk is an easy 4km loop that takes you alongside the lake to where the lagoon meets the Pacific Ocean. With pied stilts, swans, chestnut breasted shelducks, scaup, mallard and paradise ducks on display as well as herons, cormorants or black billed gulls, this walk is a must for anyone who loves to get outdoors and experience all that nature has to offer.



Staying safe when driving in Winter

Interestingly, there are fewer crashes during winter compared to the warmer months, probably because people travel less in winter and take extra steps to ensure they are safer.

People check their tyres, batteries, fluid levels, etc. and then think they have done everything needed to reduce the risks on the road. Doing that is good. However, that is not where things should stop. As we will show in this article, the decisions and actions of drivers are crucial for safety

I suspect many drivers may think that because they have done these basic vehicle checks, they can drive in the same usual manner. Considering what crash data shows, this is not the case

It may surprise you that the top five of all thirty-seven contributing factors associated with driving on ice/snow or wet roads are as follows.

Two out of every three crashes involved alcohol or drugs, loss of control or incorrect position on the road. One in ten involved inappropriate speed or inexperience. These factors add to 70% of all the reported crashes. Note that unsafe speeds or not paying attention to driving may be the reason someone loses control.

What could and should we do differently? Apart from avoiding the apparent issues listed above in the contributing factors, the first step is acknowledging that the driver is responsible for making the right choices. Do not disregard a passenger's influence on those choices to speak up when noticing the driver behaving unsafely. Rather be the unpopular person for a moment than the silent one that is dead forever.

As a driver, you are the one who is ultimately answerable for your actions when you cause injury or death to other innocent people. It takes a noble person to set aside their egotism to respond in a sensible way when the lives of people in their care are at stake.

It is shocking to see that someone would deliberately put their loved ones in danger to prove a point to someone else who may have only made a mistake. I'm referring to drivers who would not slow down or even pull over to avoid a potentially deadly crash when an approaching driver may have made a judgement error to pass when it wasn't safe.

During cold spells, our roads are unpredictable. Road controlling authorities may not be aware of ice or other slippery conditions. Between the time maintenance teams arrive to remedy the problem, it is up to each driver to drive to the prevailing road conditions. Take responsibility and make it safer for everyone.

psychosocial-meaning it stems from our thoughts in response to our surrounding environment. Yet that doesn't mean that we can't adjust our stress levels by changing what we eat. There is nothing

you eat.

on this planet that can replace a nourishing way of eating and we can support the biochemical pathways that promote a sense of calm in the body through what we consume. Here are some tips to consider.

Increase your nutrients

If you are not getting enough nutrients, your body simply doesn't have the tools it needs to be able to support the millions of biochemical processes that promote great health. Any nutrient deficiency creates stress for the systems that run your body so make a conscious effort to boost your nourishment with more home-cooked meals and additional serves of vegetables.

Foods that promote calm

Certain foods help to support a variety of interior pathways which promote a sense of calm. Some examples include foods rich in omega-3 fatty acids such as oily fish for their anti-inflammatory actions, those rich in magnesium such as green leafy vegies for their relaxing properties, and vitamin C-rich foods such as citrus and broccoli for their adrenal support.

Increase antioxidants

Stress hormones create free radicals which are unpaired units of oxygen (or other elements which run around our body causing havoc when in excess). Antioxidants donate part of themselves (electrons) to free radicals which quells their destructive tendencies and reduces oxidative stress. Coloured plant foods—think berries, red cabbage, leafy greens—are bursting with antioxidants. Eat the rainbow for a large array of nutritious substances.

Calming minerals

Stress can deplete us of certain minerals yet there are some that are necessary for a true sense of calm. Magnesium plays a key role in hormone production, and it also helps to reduce anxious feelings and relaxes muscles. Calcium is vital for maintaining pH levels in our blood, as well as for relaxation. If stress has been ongoing and persistent for you, you may benefit from supplementing these minerals for a period alongside a nourishing way of eating.

Avoid low-carb eating

While there are many carbohydrate-based products on the market today that are not at all nourishing, carbs themselves play an integral role in our energy production and are the preferred source of energy for the brain and red blood cells. Not eating enough carbs can affect blood sugar levels. Healthy blood glucose sits within a scale of 3.5-7 mmol/L and if your body drops to the lower end of that scale, it has several mechanisms it can employ to bring it back up. If you're not going to eat any carbs, one way is to release a flood of adrenaline. This can lead to night waking and trouble falling back to sleep. Try to skip the processed and refined sources of carbs but include a whole-food carbohydrate source, such as root vegetables, with each meal. 

Winter Reading Canine Cough A CASE OF

It's definitely that time of year when coughs, colds, and flus become common. And unfortunately, for our pets too.

Canine cough, also known as kennel cough, can describe several bacteria or viral conditions causing a cough in dogs, much like a cold and humans. Usually a loud hacking cough, it can sound like something is caught in their throat. This is often viral or can be bacterial, and it is highly contagious to other dogs only. Usually, with kennel cough, affected dogs are otherwise bright and happy, have no temperature, and are eating normally.

There are vaccinations for kennel cough but they do not provide 100% cover

Like the flu, even if your dog is vaccinated against the common strain, they are often not 100% protected, and there are other causative strains for the cough

Depending on the case and whether your dog has concurrent disease, treatment often involves anti-inflammatories, sometimes antibiotics, rest, and isolation from other dogs. If your dog presents, of course, please keep your dog away from other dogs and call your vet for advice to find out what the best approach is.





NEED TO KNOW

The main symptom is consistent, forceful cough.

Apart from coughing, your dog shouldn't feel I'll and should have a good appetite.

Kennel cough is highly contagious and can easily spread from one dog to another.


Kennel cough usually clears up within three weeks but can take up to 6 weeks.


Most cases shouldn't need treatment, but if you worried your vet can advise.
