

From INNOVATION to **BUSINESS**

Dave Woods works with innovations and as the manager of Precision Seafood Harvesting (PSH) his team won one of the 2014 New Zealand Innovator of the Year awards. The PSH technology is a new method of seafood harvesting and is being developed alongside a new brand name "Tiaki" (Maori for 'to protect' or 'guardianship'). The core technology is a modular harvest system (MHS), whereby the old polyethylene mesh fishing nets are replaced with ultra - high molecular weight fabrics which are high strength and lightweight. When used with new onboard handling systems, the fish caught suffer no fatigue or damage and high quality seafood is the outcome. As Dave said, "the result is the best fish



caught in the best way". There are currently ten inshore vessels fishing in the North Island that are using this

new technology. When sorting and grading fish, there are benefits in being able to keep the fish alive and the new water tank systems have increased the survival rates of any unwanted catch. The fish caught using the MHS are sold all around the world including markets in Auckland, Hawaii. Melbourne, Sydney

and China. The highest grades of fish quality are used for sashimi. The PSH partnership has produced videos that demonstrate the new technology and have received favourable feedback from scientists and fishermen. The achievements of PSH have been recognised by some celebrities with high public profiles, such as Nathan Guy (Minister of Agriculture), the King of the Netherlands and Prince Charles. Graeme Sinclair, who hosts Gone Fishin' on television has also been very positive about PSH, which has featured several times on his television programme.

Dave is a Wellington boy. He was educated at Rongotai College followed by a degree in Food Technology at Massey University. He has been

working in the fishing industry since 1986 when he started his first job with Skeggs Seafood in Nelson. After three years working there, Dave then went to Alaska and worked on a factory ship for three month contracts based out of Dutch Harbour in the Aleutian (Unalaska) Islands. He worked here off and on for eight years. In between contracts, he and his mates backpacked as often as possible around Europe. He met his Canadian wife Kim in Greece on one of these backpacking adventures. His next move was to Port Alberni (Vancouver Island BC) on the Barkley Sound where he set up a seafood plant to process Pacific hake. While here they lived at Sproat Lake - an ideal existence for his young boys with a boat and a floating dock.

predominantly for snapper, is a work in progress. It is a big business, with ten boats working inshore and ten factory boats deep water fishing all round NZ. The next task is to streamline the manufacture of the gear, so that the production is more efficient.

Dave is not a man to let the grass grow under his feet. While his three boys were still at school he coached junior rugby for Old Boys. The family spend many happy hours boating up at the lakes or in the Marlborough Sounds where they all enjoy their water sports. Dave also enjoys hunting and tramping and he was a member of the winning Aorangi curling team at Tekapo last winter. Next on the agenda is walking the 800km El Camino Norte with his wife Kim in May.

Online Library browser

How amazing would it be to quickly find out whether your public library has a copy of a book that has been recommended to you, or that you have discovered while searching online? How convenient would it be to then push a button and be directed straight to the library's catalogue where you could place a hold on the title? Book lovers in South Canterbury can reioice because Timaru District Libraries have been added to Library Extension.

Library Extension is a browser extension that can be installed on Chrome or Firefox from www.librarvextension.com. It is free to use and easy to set up. Once Library Extension has been installed and Timaru District Libraries selected, when browsing books on websites such as Amazon and Book Depository, you will instantly be able to see if Timaru District Libraries holds the book. If the book is held in the collection, pushing the 'borrow' button will take you to the library catalogue where a hold can be put on the title. It is so easy! If the library does not have



the book you can ask staff to consider purchasing it for the collection.

Goodreads is the world's largest website community for readers and book recommendations. Becoming a member of the site allows you to share book recommendations with friends, track what you have read and read reviews of books. You can also create a list of books that you want to read. Library Extension is available on Goodreads so once you have found your next great read, you can easily check to see whether it is available at your library.

Ben and partner Lori paid a lot of attention to the smaller details, with the entire flat repainted, all new doors and fittings and a re-fitted kitchen and bathroom. Windows were replaced with double glazing, though they decided to retain the original wooden lounge windows.

As one of Timaru's uber cool retail destinations, the Royal Arcade has attracted a loyal following over the years, offering a quiet refuge from the relative bustle of Stafford Street.

The retail glass and steel alleyway takes its cue from arcades which sprung up across major cities during the 19th century. Timaru's version dates back to the early 1900s with the addition of a glass roof in 1996 creating a colonnade joining Stafford with Sophia Streets.

"In any big city it would be a major drawcard," says one tenant, the view being that in the Timaru context its understated entrance ways has made it a slightly clandestine destination for those on the hunt for a specialty shop or quietly visiting their lawyer or architect.

On the latter front the arcade has become a focal point for professional services firms, including two architectural firms (NB Architects and DLA Architects), Sloane Legal, design agency Goanna and structural engineering company Structex – all of which have been long term tenants.

The food and beverage offerings have been a bit more hit and miss. After taking over 16 Royal Arcade from the popular Petite cocktail bar in 2017, Francesca's Pizzeria closed its doors recently, while nearby Asian style outlet Food Haven has also recently moved shop. Essence understands two new eateries are moving in soon.

In general the common sentiment of those tenants who Essence spoke to is that it's a great place to work but not everyone does well unless you already have a client base who know where you are.

One Friday a month the Arcade also hosts the Arcadia Night Market, featuring eco-conscious products, live music and a healthy dose of community spirit. A lot of the ground floor businesses remain open during the evening markets, including the two popular hair salons – Sweeney Todd's and Cocoon Hair Design.



Overnight Chocolate Chia Seed Pudding

Servings: (1/2-cup servings)

INGREDIENTS

1/4 cup cacao powder or unsweetened cocoa powder 3-5 Tbsp maple syrup

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon (optional)

1 pinch sea salt 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

1 1/2 cups Almond Breeze Almondmilk Original Unsweetened (or light coconut milk for creamier texture) 1/2 cup chia seeds

METHOD

- 1. To a small mixing bowl add cacao powder (sift first to reduce clumps), maple syrup, ground cinnamon, salt, and vanilla and whisk to combine. Then add a little dairy-free milk at a time and whisk until a paste forms. Then add remaining dairy-free milk and whisk until smooth.
- 2. Add chia seeds and whisk once more to combine. Then cover and refrigerate overnight, or at least 3-5 hours (until it's achieved a pudding-like consistency).
- 3. Leftovers keep covered in the fridge for 4-5 days, though best when fresh. Serve chilled with desired toppings, such as fruit, granola, or coconut whipped cream.



Making a wedding mood board is one of the most helpful activities in the wedding planning process. Not only does the practice encourage you to make decisions about the look of your day, but it can also aid in defining the overall vibe your wedding will have.

1. Identify Guide Words

The first step in making a wedding mood board is identifying guide words that describe how you want your day to feel. It could be romantic, elegant, classic, vintage, rustic or bohemian to name a few.

You need to decide the context for the look and feel of your day. Decide what season the wedding will take place. This can impact the look and feel of your location and venue.

2. Embrace Color + Texture

Whether you're using Pinterest, magazines, or found inspiration from your everyday life, start looking through your inspiration source to see which colors you most associate with your guide words. 

Is passing your driver test on the first attempt possible?

The purpose of a driving test is to assess the competency of a road user against a standard to check they are safe to be on the road and that they make the correct decisions.

The first step is to get a copy of the "Road code"!

The reality is that like all things worth having, it's worth doing right. Unless they put in some effort they are not going to be successful in the process. Gaining a drivers licence is about ensuring your child is safe on our roads and they can drive to the standards to make safe decisions. Testing Officers are professional people who are trained and certified to observe the driving skills and behaviours you display and record them according to pre-set standard. Three main areas that all new drivers can work on, are observation, speed control and positioning on the road.

Observation

"Many applicants go through the motions, like when looking in the mirrors or checking their blind spots, but fail to actually comprehend what they are doing. It is not about moving the head, but about taking in what they see", says one of the local Testing Officers.

Speed control

Speed control is important and is another common mistake during the driving test. The Testing Officer will tell you to drive to the conditions, and obey all the posted speed limits including temporary speed limits. Being

aware of these are you proceed around the course and adjusting accordingly prior to the sign shows that you have mastered the skill of managing your speed control.

Position on the road (before turning and when turning)

When driving it is important to stay in your lane. When making a right hand turn ensure that you do not cut the corner, this can be very dangerous. As per the road code try to stay as far left as practicable which will keep you safe from oncoming vehicles


All drivers should know the road code as this is the basic guide for all our road rules and how to apply them. We recommend getting a few lessons with a registered driving instructor and practise, practise and practise! It is a good idea to make sure that you practice the correct ways shown by the instructor. Lastly it is always a good idea to get a couple of lessons before the actual test as this will help to polish your child's driving performance

If your child was unsuccessful and had to re-sit the restricted test it would cost \$86.60. For this amount you can get more than an hour worth of professional instruction, something to ponder.

- Trouble staying focussed on your driving task
- Slow reactions, like braking too late
- Making incorrect choices
- Taking unnecessary risks
- Travel over some distance without remembering doing it • Trouble keeping your head up
- Drifting all over the road, like over the centre line or too close to the side of the road.



Other interesting facts about driver fatigue

Good drivers can read the road and traffic conditions to take evasive actions when needed. On the other hand dodgy drivers drive like zombies, unaware of what's happening around them. This makes them and other road users extremely vulnerable.

- It is more dangerous to drive between 1am and 5am than at any other time of the day. The next most dangerous time is between 1pm and 5pm
- If you drive after staying awake for 17 hours, you will behave like a driver who is just below the legal blood alcohol limit
- If you drive after staying awake for 24 hours, you are just as dangerous as someone who is over the legal blood alcohol limit

On short trips in town, take a taxi, catch the bus or ride with a friend or colleague.

Not all cars are equally safe

Vehicles have evolved over the past hundred plus years, from being basically a motorised horse cart to the modern autonomous models available today.

However the basic design and controls have not changed that much. As we learned from experience, cars were equipped with features that made driving more convenient and especially in the past decade, made them much safer.

We acknowledge the millions of people who paid with their lives and billions of victims who were killed or seriously injured during this time.

There are active and passive safety systems in cars. Active safety systems are those that assist by trying to prevent a crash in the first place and Passive systems reduce the injury during a crash.

Vehicle manufacturers compete by offering latest technology in their models. However, you will find that most of these safety systems are only available in the high end models.

There are several vehicle safety assessment facilities (New Car Assessment Programme – NCAP) in the world, of which the models we get here in New Zealand, are usually tested at the Australian New Car Assessment Programme -ANCAP www.ancap.com.au.

The maximum achievable score is five stars. There are four categories, adult occupant protection (38), child occupant protection (49), vulnerable road user protection (48), and safety assist (13). The numbers in brackets indicate the maximum achievable score for that particular

category. Nevertheless not all cars receive the maximum score, you have to compare the performance of the different models

It is important to know that while all cars are given a safety score zero to five stars, that within the same classes, the scores may be different.

All tests at NCAP are done under similar conditions.

In New Zealand we also have the Used Car Safety Ratings (UCSR – https://rightcar.govt.nz). Safety ratings are created by using records from over 8 million vehicles involved in police-reported road crashes. The vehicle's size and weight, design, and safety features it has, such as airbags and types of seat belts, are all taken into account. (Source Right Car website)

Common myths about vehicle safety

MYTH: When you drive a car with safety features, you can take more risks as these safety features will save you from crashing and serious injury.

FACT: The safety features are designed to assist during normal driving conditions. It may likely improve your chances of surviving a crash or reduce serious injury, but they have only been tested for common crash scenarios. For example, frontal impact crashes have only been tested at 64 kilometres per hour. Safety features require the user to use safety belts.

MYTH: The safer the vehicle the more expensive it is.

FACT: There are many older models available with good safety features as seen on the Rightcar website.

MYTH: Old cars are heavier and built more solidly that is why they must be safer.

FACT: Modern cars are built to reduce the physical forces on the occupants inside the vehicle. Older cars may be solid, but in crashes they do not absorb the impact forces as well as modern cars do.



Q. What does this little light on my mirror mean?

Many new vehicles are filled with an array of advanced modern safety features, and getting your head around them all can be overwhelming if you're coming out of a '92 Corolla!

One of the most common features you'll find is 'Blind Spot Detection'. Generally there will be a small amber indicator on your wing mirrors or A-Pillars. When there is another vehicle behind you in either Blind Spot, these indicators will illuminate to let you know without having to break your neck to look behind you.

With the shorter days and outstanding Timaru fog that we have to endure at this time of the year, Blind Spot Detection is an indispensable and potentially life-saving function.

Q. What's this 'Forward Collision Warning' nonsense all about?

Let's be honest, we live in a stunning part of the country. Of a Sunday afternoon you'll probably find yourself cruising around the countryside, surrounded by Autumnal beauty. It is very easy to lose focus of what is in front of you simply because of all that is around you.

Forward Collision Warning uses a central radar (and/or camera system) in the front of the vehicle to detect if the distance between you and an object/vehicle in front of you is approaching too quickly. If the vehicle recognises that you are not going to pull the reins in quick enough, it will give you an audible and/or visual warning to draw your attention in quickly and avoid a serious accident.

Gone are the days where you'd easily squeeze a family of 8 into the Datsun and a seatbelt was an optional extra. Although all these fandangle things can appear from the outside as nothing more than a distraction, these driver aids are there to ensure one thing - your safety.

Secondly think about how many people also have the same degree, consider the volume of graduates that come out in that year, all to apply for the same job.


Thirdly, the most common question asked by employers, "Do you have any work experience?"

How do you light your fire?

An upside-down fire-lighting technique can save time and reduce air pollution. The upside-down technique – also known as 'top down' or 'Swiss style' - is gaining in popularity and the team gets plenty of feedback that it's working well for people.

"If you want a fire that gets going quickly, saving on time and excess smoke, then we'd recommend trying this technique, which uses larger pieces of wood at the bottom and kindling on top. You can walk away with confidence that your fire will be getting off to a good start and heating up fast," says Ray.

If you prefer the traditional bottom-up approach, you can still get your fire going quickly and efficiently by using a good amount of dry kindling.

Resist the overnight smoulder


Adding a log to your wood burner and turning down the airflow to slowly burn through the night is not only a big cause of air pollution but also an inefficient way to heat your home.

"If your wood burner is working well, and your house is well-insulated, then you shouldn't need to leave wood smouldering overnight at a low temperature

stresses the importance of getting the basics right if you choose to burn wood

as this causes excess smoke," says Ray.

He suggests getting your fire burning hot and smokefree before going to bed but to accept and plan for it to burn out

"Resist the habit of 'keeping the fire burning' overnight. If you feel your house is getting too cold overnight, then you may have an issue with insulation and draughts."

Is your wood 'good'?

It may sound simple, but having good wood is key to running an efficient fire that burns clean.

"If a chimney is smoking badly it's often the fuel that's the problem," said Ray.

"It's important to ensure the wood you're using is dry and seasoned. Wet wood will simply not burn hot enough to heat your home well and will also smoke out your neighbours."

Ray advises using a Trusted Good Wood Merchant to source wood and stocking up at least a season ahead. Environment Canterbury can also test the moisture content of wood for you.

Support is available

If you need to upgrade from an older-style wood burner, Environment Canterbury's Better Burning Advisors are happy to talk through different financial options available for Timaru, Geraldine and Waimate households.

Subsidies ranging from \$500 to \$5000 are available for low-income households who meet certain criteria. In addition, Healthier Homes Canterbury launched in September last year, where eligible ratepayers can apply for a rates advance of up to \$6,000 to help purchase home heating, insulation and ventilation.



Brilliant Balt Good for a party or just family fun

Bali is consistently rated at the top for traveller's choice awards. In 2017 it was ranked number one in TripAdvisor's global destination rankings. Former Craighead and current University of Auckland student Sam von Melville recently spent 10 days in Indonesia's hot spot on a family visit, finding out first-hand what all the fuss is about.

Further north and inland Ubud is a must see for those who enjoy culture and tradition, as the many temples, rice terraces and walks give insight into the culturally diverse and interesting Balinese world. For some more fun and to make some furry friends, a visit to the Ubud Monkey Forest, where you can explore the natural forest sanctuary alongside the cute Macaques, is a must do.

From Ubud we booked a driver (you really don't want to drive in Bali, trust me) for what is a relatively short 3 hour drive (about 30kms!) to Sanur, on the Eastern side of Bali. As it was the last couple of days of our trip we thought it time for some luxury. And that we got, poolside at the Grand Palace Hotel, close to the launch points for the fast boats from Bali to Lombok and numerous islands in between – including the famous Gili Islands – most famous for the party island of Gili Trawangan (Gili T).

We were on a time budget so we opted for Lebongan Island; a place where the crystal clear water and pristine beaches are reminiscent of travel brochures. Renowned for diving, we were disappointed that the swells were

too large to do any scuba-ing during our day trip, as well as made for a somewhat bumpy boat ride over. However renting two mopeds to

explore the island provided much more excitement (as well as trepidation). Make sure you practice before you ride, as the very narrow, windy roads can be intimidating to first-time riders – which we were. But we did manage to negotiate ourselves over the yellow bridge to Ceningan island – finding a classic beach side restaurant with picturesque beach views and an infinity pool in which we enjoyed our well-deserved chilled Bintangs and ice teas.

It was a really enjoyable trip. I'd go again - and I'd see the attraction of going with friends. My only word of advice – it's hot and humid. So pack accordingly. Better yet, don't pack much. It'll give you the chance to barter more.
