Running a general practice is busy, complex and increasingly hard work and our local doctors are run off their feet. I had a chat at one of Timaru's newest practices, Medi Clinic, where two delightful young women are training as nurse practitioner interns. Caroline Gander comes from Malaysia and Tabitha Kahwema from Zimbabwe.



Tell me a little about your backgrounds?

Caroline: I was brought up in Kuala Lumpur and came to New Zealand as a registered nurse after graduating in 2010. I lived in Auckland for 1 ½ years and worked in a rest home delivering rest home and hospital level care for six months. I came to Timaru in 2012 to work in AT&R for two years at the Timaru Hospital, followed by work in the Emergency Department. I started work at the Medi Clinic in April this year.

Tabitha: My family came to Auckland from Harare as missionaries in 2003 when I was just five and then we moved to Vancouver in Canada where I completed secondary school. In 2014 we moved to Dunedin where I did my nursing training. I graduated in 2017 and worked in a rest home and then for the SDHB in Dunedin. I also started work at the Medi Clinic this year.

What attracted you to New Zealand?

Caroline: I wanted to practice outside Malaysia and I had family already living in New Zealand. As a city girl who grew up in the rat race in Kuala Lumpur, the quality of life appealed here where people seem to enjoy the more relaxed lifestyle. I even became a ballroom and Latin dancing "junkie" after moving to Timaru. I have married a good kiwi man and we now have two young daughters aged five and three.

Tabitha: I came with my parents and although we moved to Canada in 2008, I consider New Zealand to be my home. In 2020

I married another Zimbabwean who followed me out here and we love the laidback lifestyle which offers so many opportunities. We love how New Zealand is a multicultural country and we feel a sense of belonging here in Aotearoa. I love to serve my whanau and my community, whether it is through cooking a meal, entertaining, or even using my skills and knowledge to empower others around me. I love children and I am looking forward to having children of my own with my husband in beautiful Timaru.

Tell me about your study?

Both women are completing their studies to become qualified nurse practitioners. Caroline is completing her Masters in Advanced Nursing Practice from the University of Otago and Tabitha is doing her Masters in Clinical Nursing through Massey. This year has been a challenging one with the various study requirements and the effects of Covid. The different alert levels and having to complete their placements in different practice areas has not always been easy.

They both acknowledged the shortage of doctors and subsequent burnout in New Zealand. A lot of older doctors are retiring and locums are not always easy to find. Most Timaru practices seem to be able to retain their staff and New Zealand is an attractive destination if overseas doctors can get their residency. Caroline and Tabitha see their role as filling the gaps in primary healthcare to make healthcare accessible to the community, and delivering

healthcare with a fusion of the nursing and medical models of care. The Medi Clinic is lucky to have these two!

The catering team have spent the last few months fine-tuning the menu with the help of club staff including general manager Vince Gardner who has added chief taste-





Mayors Desk

Mackenzie has its Long Term Plan out for consultation so if you wish to comment or discuss any of its content please go to our website to have your say before 5pm on Friday November 5th when consultation closes. We are proud of our plan which is robust and has outcomes over the next 3 - 10 years that we believe are needed to raise the bar and take our district forward.

Mayor's Taskforce for Jobs (MTFJ) offered Rural Councils the opportunity to apply for funding to assist youth who are not in education, employment or training, and/or people who have been displaced due to COIVD-19. Mackenzie District Council received \$250,000 in the 20/21 year and were able to assist with 38 employment placements with 27 different employers, putting over \$180,000 back into the local economy In 21/22 year, MDC have assisted with 13 employment placements so far.




The Mackenzie District is currently experiencing a critical labour shortage and our businesses are struggling to fill vacancies particularly as we head towards the busy summer season.

Your Garden this Month

Minette Tonoli is a herb enthusiast and horticulturist, a true Earth Mother, who gets excited about sharing her love for the plethora of food and medicine plants she grows and uses at her home acre in Waikuku.

There has been a phenomenal burst of growth in the garden recently, and with the lovely warm weather, and rain, I expect a lush garden this summer.

Garden tasks this month

It's all systems go for gardening at the moment – you can plant nearly anything and everything in November, but be aware of late frosts and cold winds. With the variable weather you have to be ready with frost coverings and make sure all your plans are staked and tied down well, and for those sweltering and dry days, water and shade should be priorities.

As always, when sowing or transplanting take care to note the regional climate zone and the specific microclimates you have in your own garden to ensure the right growing conditions are present for the plants you want to grow.



Early to mid-season is also an excellent time to be vigilant for any bug infestations. When you walk around your garden, take note of which plants show pest damage, and see about finding eco-friendly solutions before it becomes serious enough to inhibit your plant's performance. Sometimes all you need though is a bit of patience as nature often "rights itself" and balance gets restored, especially if you have a natural and organic approach to gardening: e.g., ladybugs coming into the garden just as aphids seem to get out of control.

Sowing and planting

The Canterbury region is rather large, with quite a few different climate zones scattered about – even the microclimate in your own garden can make a difference, so be sure to use the following as an ideas list only, and check seed packets or seedling labels for more information specific to your exact growing conditions.

Veggies

Pretty much anything from A-Z can be sown or planted late spring. Here's a few ideas:

Sow seed of amaranth, artichoke (globe), beans,

spring onion and sweet corn.

beetroot, silverbeet, chicory, carrot, Chinese cabbage, cucumber, lettuce, radish, pumpkin,

Plant asparagus crowns, Jerusalem artichoke tubers, kumara slips, and seed potato. Seedlings of brassicas like broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower be planted, as well as warm season crops such as eggplant, capsicums, chillies, tomatoes, squash, tomatillo, watermelon and zucchini. Also onion, NZ spinach, Florence fennel, and leek spedlings

Herbs

Sow herbs like chervil, chives, coriander, lemon balm, oregano and marjoram, rosemary, sage, and savory.

Transplant seedlings of basil, tarragon, mint, parsley, thyme, and rocket. Plant crowns of horseradish and rhubarb. Plant comfrey.

Fruit and Flowers

Sow Cape gooseberry seeds, plant raspberry, strawberry and passionfruit plants, and citrus.

Sow or plant calendula, cleome, cornflower, marigold,



Tomato Thoughts

Late October to mid-November is tomato planting time, and as a crazy tomato lady with seeds for hundreds of varieties of heirloom tomatoes, I share a few of my tomato thoughts.

sweetpea, coreopsis, snapdragon, zinnia...and many more!

When to plant:

Some say Labour Day and others say no earlier than Christchurch Show Day, but there's no "one size fits all" - every year is a bit different weather wise as is each garden. What is important is that tomatoes are warm season croppers that don't like frosts or cold wind. There's an old wives' tale that says that you can plant them when you can sit with your bare bum on the soil comfortably!

Heirloom vs Hybrids:

Heirloom tomatoes have stood the test of time for their exquisite taste and interesting colours and shapes. They are easy to save seed from too, coming true to type, meaning your future tomatoes will be the same as the parent.

Hybrid tomatoes are great too, they are often bred to produce abundantly, generally have crops of uniform tomatoes, and have other special traits like being good for pots or showing specific disease resistance. While you can save seed from hybrid tomatoes, your resulting plants very likely will not produce a tomato similar to the parent.

How to plant:

Plant deep (include most of the stem underground) to ensure your tomato develops a good root system.

Add amendments (optional) - you can add a cocktail of interesting things like fish heads, blood and bone, horse manure, eggshells, even Epsom salts and milk powder. But, if you did your groundwork, and your soil is good, your plants won't need more than seaweed conditioner and some fertilizer through the season.

- Stake and support growing plants well.
- Mulch to retain moisture
- Companion plant with marigold, calendula, basil, borage, marjoram, chives, or parsley.
- Check regularly for pests and diseases.
- Enjoy your harvest!



Who would be better to ask for advice on driving than a world champion rally driver? It's not such a great idea, you think, and you would be right. We do not need racing mentality on public roads. moment what to expect.

Haydon is a local here in South Canterbury, although our community share him with the rest of the world. He got stuck in New Zealand due to the Covid-19 lockdown restrictions on international travel. So, he thought this would be a perfect opportunity to give something back to the community for all their support.

Even though he has many world class achievements, he is still humble and that is what makes it great to work on a road safety campaign with him. He is mentally and physically on top of his game, but he is also a regular guy, a road user like the rest of us. As a driver on public roads, he is as calm as you can get because he able to distinguish between Hayden in a race and Hayden on the road.

Haydon's standards are high. He would not put himself in a predicament because he knows better. And that is

the message he helps to promote. When on the road, you are not in a race. In a race they control the environment. The public has no vehicle access to the route, every driver heads in the same direction, the cars and drivers are top spec, and the drivers all have navigators telling them every

On public roads, its different. There are none of these helps a rally driver has available except his or her sound decision-making skills. People can learn that too, but at the end it is still a conscious decision the driver makes.

Our aim is to make drivers aware of the risks involved when entering bends too fast. You may be travelling within the speed limit but approaching most bends at that speed is extremely risky. The crash data shows that losing control at bends are one of the three most dangerous crash types.



Head-on crashes and loss of control on straight roads are

The safest choice is to slow down enough before entering the bend so that you do not have to brake hard in the bend. Most crashes happen because drivers go in too fast and hit the brakes hard causing the vehicle to become unstable and go out of control.



Fresh Water for Flowers VALÉRIE PERRIN

Violette Toussaint is the caretaker at a cemetery in a small town in Bourgogne. Random visitors, regulars, and, most notably her colleagues—three gravediggers, three groundskeepers and a priest visit her as often as possible to warm themselves in her lodge, where laughter, companionship, and occasional tears mix with the coffee that she offers them. Her daily life is lived to the rhythms of their hilarious and touching confidences. A cast of characters cross Violette's path and their stories are revealed as the novel progresses. Her missing husband



Phillipe, his mean-spirited mother and father, her dearest friends Celia and Sasha, the former caretaker of the cemetery who makes her laugh. She hasn't had a happy life, with exception of the years with her daughter Léonine. Abandoned at birth, moving from foster home to foster home, she seeks solace in a marriage which isn't a happy one.

Her life, though, will be changed forever when Julien Seul shows up at her door bringing with him the story of his mother Irene Fayolle, whose ashes he wishes to bury at the gravesite of a man buried there. The plot becomes a little more complicated as the stories entwine. This is a beautifully written story of tragic loss and grief, but it is tempered by friendship and beautiful memories and love.
