The Magic of Christmas

Those of you who missed the Sutherlands Christmas Trail missed out on a treat. The local community organised this fundraiser to restore the historic Sutherlands Hall to its former glory. Seven local homes were beautifully decorated for Christmas by Ballantynes, Bloomers, Flowers Inc, Guthrie Bowron and The Mill Road Store. Besides admiring the decorated houses there were gardens to enjoy, olive oil tastings, live music, an art exhibition and a scrumptious afternoon tea, plus a delicious rhubarb and raspberry spritzer and strawberries and icecream.

This area has a rich history, with the first settlers being Alexander Sutherland and his wife Catherine, after whom the area is named. They built the first sod cottage in the area in 1868 and as family finances improved, the house was expanded with a second lean-to and three bedrooms. Limestone was quarried on the property and was used to clad the original cottage. Nineteen years ago Gay and Frank Claridge decided they wanted to move closer to their family roots and they bought this property. Doing it up has been a real labour of love, modernising and renovating in keeping with the age of the 152 year old cottage. They put in a new kitchen and bathroom and stripped the floors back to their original wood. They remodeled the fireplace using blocks of Oamaru stone and the whole house was

repainted, recarpeted and re-curtained. The extensive country cottage garden ablaze with roses, delphiniums and lupins really complements the house.

The Scottish/ Gaelic name for the house is "Baile Chnuick', which means "house on the hill" or "a place of peace and tranquility". Gay told me, "It has always been a house of hospitality". Alexander and Catherine Sutherland were renowned for their open-handed hospitality. Parson, swagger, drover or neighbour - all were equally made welcome by the Sutherlands, who possessed that somewhat rare characteristic of it making absolutely no difference in the hospitality shown to the man of position or the swagger off the road. This same hospitality was extended to those who attended the recent Christmas Trail.

Gay and Frank have created something very special with this beautiful character home and garden. We were privileged to share this lovely home with its tasteful display of Christmas decorations, a stunningly set Christmas table and a beautiful Christmas tree and stockings. Afternoon tea was served on vintage china in an adjoining shed, which was also beautifully decorated. The Christmas Trail was a wonderful community effort to preserve the historical hall for future generations to enjoy.



4 MUST-DO WALKS IN TIMARU DISTRICT

Timaru's seaside location means fantastic coastal walks where you can see penguins and the occasional whale, or head inland for beautiful bushwalks and waterfalls.

We've got Department of Conservation campsites with forest and river walks, and mountainous Mesopotamia for hiking and other adventures in the historic high country. There are heaps of fantastic walks throughout the district, here are 4 to get

1. GO CHASING WATERFALLS **Acland Falls Track, Peel Forest** 1 hour return

If you're into walks that encompass original native forest, bird song and waterfalls, head to beautiful Peel Forest.

Acland Falls is your reward for a fabulous bush walk that starts off with a bit of a climb, all under the cover of ancient oodocarp forest.

There are plenty of tracks to explore at Peel Forest. You'll find something for all ages and abilities, including the wheelchair accessible Big Tree Walk.

2. CLIMB A LITTLE MOUNTAIN Little Mt Peel/Huatekerekere, Peel Forest - 5 hours return

Known as one of the best day walks in Canterbury, but it should come with a disclaimer of 'not so little'.

The round trip takes around 6 hours, and you're rewarded with expansive 360 degree views at the top. Compulsory Instagram photo on the trig station at the top - tag us

No visit to Peel Forest is complete without calling into The Green Man licensed cafe for refreshments. Known for live music nights, fabulous food, craft beers, and be sure to try the recently released and locally produced Humdinger gin.

3. LIGHTHOUSE AND SHIPWRECKS

Dashing Rocks Walk, Timaru 1 hour return

There are lots of cool short walks in Timaru City. A favourite with locals, given its coastal views and proximity to eateries and shopping, is the Dashing Rocks walk.

Wander the cliffs past a historic lighthouse, and the site of ancient shipwrecks where the waves crash into volcanic rock.

Start with brunch, or finish with sunset drinks at the fabulous row of eateries at the top of the Bay Hill.

If coastal walks with lighthouses are your thing, you should also check out





Tuhawaiki (Jack's) Point. This is also a great track for biking.

4. WALK, SHOP AND EAT IN GERALDINE

Riverside Walkway, Geraldine

Popular with visitors, Geraldine is a charming boutique village just 30 minutes drive from Timaru City and 1.5 hours' drive from Christchurch. Geraldine is also the gateway to the Mackenzie region.

One of the best ways to experience Geraldine is on foot. Start by walking the Riverside Walkway with its exotic Rhododendron plants. Cross the road and take in the native trees and birdsong of the Talbot Forest tracks, and then loop back around to the main shopping area with its specialty stores and eateries.



The Kimbell Silverstream Hotel, 5 minutes drive from Fairlie has been known as a great local pub since 1878. New owners Caro and Lockie Broadfoot, who took over in April of this year, want to carry on that tradition of hospitality and this summer they're hoping to welcome locals and visitors alike to enjoy their newly revamped beer garden.

The outdoor surroundings with shaded seating is the perfect spot for a family lunch, a group get together or just to sit back and enjoy a drink with a friend on a sunny, Sunday afternoon. There are lawn games to entertain young and old alike and a great summer menu full of delicious dishes to suit all tastes.

Bestsellers include ribeye steaks and buttermilk fried chicken burgers whilst their broccoli salad with haloumi is proving a star turn with vegetarians and even meat-eaters who want a healthy side. The sweet-toothed can round off the meal with a chocolate brownie and ice-cream. A dedicated children's menu

includes chicken nuggets, fish bites and mini-hotdogs. Staff are also happy to make smaller portions of adult dishes and will cater to any dietary requirements wherever possible

There's a wine list and the usual old favourites like Speights and DB on tap. They've also sourced some unique offerings for the beer connoisseur with a selection of beers from Rhyme and Reason Brewery in Wanaka – so why not try something new?

I'm a big fan of Julie Biuso's and at this time of year, my favourite summer recipes from her cook book Never-ending Summer, get a thrashing. I've lost count of how many Essence end-of-year parties have had food inspired by Julie. So I'm pretty excited about her latest book - Shared Kitchen, in which she teams up with daughter *Ilaria to create "real food from scratch"*.

Enjoy these recipes and tips on how to share the cooking load on Christmas day.



Barbecued Lamb with Aromatics

Serves 4 or more

This prime lamb dish is quick to cook and even more quickly gobbled up. Serve with salad, in buns or sliders, or with vegetables such as eggplant (aubergine) and peppers (bell peppers / capsicums). I like it on grilled sourdough spread with a cannellini bean dip and salad leaves and topped with fried or barbecued egaplant slices and grilled or slow-roasted tomatoes. Scrumptious.

- 600 g (1 lb, 3 oz) thinnish piece boneless leg of
- 1 Tbsp olive oil

cooked lamb

- 1 tsp creamy Dijonnaise mustard
- 3 cloves garlic, peeled and thickly sliced
- Few sprigs rosemary and oregano Freshly ground black pepper to taste
- 1 tsp flaky sea salt, plus extra for sprinkling over

Pat meat with paper towels to absorb moisture. Trim if necessary, Put oil. mustard, garlic, herbs and seasonings in a dish and stir together. Add lamb and coat it all over with the marinade. Cover lamb with a food umbrella or similar and leave at room temperature for about

Preheat a covered barbecue or, if your barbecue doesn't have a hood, improvise using an upturned heavy-duty roasting tin. Toss lamb one more time in marinade, picking off and reserving garlic and herbs. Place lamb fat side down on barbecue and strew the top with the

garlic and herbs. Lower barbecue hood and turn gas to low. Cook for 7 minutes.

Turn lamb over and cook for a further 5 minutes. If the lamb weighs more than 600 g (1 lb, 3 oz) you may not necessarily have to cook it any longer — it is the thickness of the meat, not the length of it, that affects the cooking time (see Recipe Notes).

Remove lamb to a board and sprinkle all over with salt. Rest lamb for 5-7 minutes, then slice thinly with a carving knife.



When the lamb feels flabby to the touch, it is rare. When it feels springy it is medium-rare. If it feels firm, it is medium and if it feels hard it is well done.

I like this lamb cooked to medium-rare. It will continue to cook a little more as it rests and will remain juicy. If the piece of lamb you have is an uneven thickness, with a thicker chumpy bit, cut the chumpy thicker bit off and cook it a little longer than the rest of the meat. In my book the worst thing you can do to a beautiful piece of meat like this is to overcook it. Keep it pink and juicy. Maximum 12 minutes (six minutes each side)! Be brave! Yes, lots of exclamation marks, but I need your full attention. And I'm not sure chumpy is a word, but I reckon you can work out what I mean.





The 15 Squadron Timaru Cadet Corps: **A Well Kept Secret**

I knew very little about the armed forces involvement in Timaru until I paid them a visit recently and had a chat to Squadron Leader Mark Morris (who has been in command for 15 years) and Corporal Brock Potter (a cadet). I learned that the difference between Cadet Forces and any other youth organisation is the structure and culture. Cadet forces units are based upon a military framework, with three branches, each following their parent units in the regular Navy, Army or Air Force. Their vision is "to prepare New Zealand's leaders of tomorrow".

The 15 Squadron Timaru Cadet Corps is one of 25 units in the South Island and currently has 17 members. This particular unit is somewhat unusual to other units because it is a combined Air. Sea and Army unit. Corporal Brock Potter, aged 16 is in his 4th year. He joined because his older brother had joined and Brock's original reason for joining was the opportunity to learn to fly. He enjoys the camaraderie, the discipline and the opportunities for leadership and

teamwork. His ultimate aim is to become a Warrant Officer. He would also like to pursue a career as a commercia pilot when he leaves school.

This youth programme is open to both boys and girls aged between 13 and 19. It is run in partnership with the New Zealand Defence

Force with an emphasis on fostering the spirit of adventure and teamwork, and to develop those qualities which are essential for good citizens and future leaders. The culture is challenging and allows many opportunities for the development of character. Like a soldier goes through basic training, so the culture could be described as a bit like being permanently on a recruit course. Much is expected and through rigorous adventure and military flavoured training, the recruits learn things like

having to iron their own uniforms to look smart, being pushed outside their physical comfort zone and boldly facing challenging

Members of the squadron regularly travel all over the country participating in everything from exploring Navy boats when in port to visiting the Waiouru Military Base, and they often head up to Burnham Military Base for group activities. They take part in national competitions and courses, get invited to attend Warbirds over Wanaka bi-annually to help with displays and security, and they also have a special role in our local ANZAC and Armistice



Day parades as flag bearers. Some of the opportunities offered include leadership training courses, shooting, foot and rifle drill, first aid, navigation, physical training, NZQA credits, tramping, bush craft, radio procedure, flying and gliding, sailing and life skills. The recruits work their way up the ranks and come out with a healthy respect for people and living their best life full of

A very successful graduate from 15 Squadron is Theon Te Koeti, who grew up in Pleasant Point and became head boy at Pleasant Point High School, from where he was selected to join the Royal New Zealand Air Force.

He moved to Canada in



Canadian Air Force where he gained his full military pilot stripes and became a NATO training instructor for the Hawk light fighter jets. Theon now spends his

time flying Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau around the world. So the opportunities are endless!

The 15 Squadron is always looking for more recruits. Recruiting takes place between November and March and their Cadet Training Centre at 61 Coonoor Road (below the Timaru Christian School) is open for visits. They meet every Thursday evening during the school terms for Parade nights from 6.30 pm - 9.30 pm. Costs vary from unit to unit. This is approximately \$10 a week, which includes a free uniform and about 14 weekend activities. They can be found on Facebook or at Timarucadetunits@ cadetforces.org.nz

- Tyres Think of your tyres like your feet if they're compromised, you'll go nowhere fast. From Afghan Army to Aide-de-Camp

Frankie Thompson (age 27) recently received a New Zealand Defence Force commendation for her outstanding work on gender equality with women in the Afghan National Army. She received her commendation from Commander Joint Forces New Zealand, Rear Admiral Jim Gilmour, who noted that Frankie's "performance greatly exceeded expectations for a junior captain and is worthy of formal recognition".

Frankie was born and brought up throughout the UK and she emigrated with her family to NZ in July 2007. After leaving Craighead in 2009, Frankie completed a Diploma in Outdoor Recreation at Ara (then Aoraki Polytechnic), after which she joined the NZ Army in 2011. The Army runs in Frankie's family with two of her brothers also being serving officers in the British Army. She commenced her initial training in 2011 in Waiouru, and was swiftly selected to undergo the training in Australia from 2011 -2016 at the Australian Defence Force Academy and the Royal Military College Duntroon, both in Canberra. Here she won the Top International Officer Cadet Award and she also gained a Civil Engineering Degree with Honours. She is currently completing a Masters in International Development through Massey University, hoping to specialise in gender, peace and security.

So how did Frankie end up in Afghanistan? The Kabul Afghan National Army Officer Academy was established as an education and training facility for the Afghan Armed Forces and took in its first intake of men in 2013. The first intake of women occurred in the following year. It is led by the United Kingdom and has united mentoring efforts from New Zealand, Australia, and Denmark

When NZ Army Captain Frankie Thompson, Second in Command 3rd Field Squadron, 2nd Engineer Regiment arrived at the Academy for her nine month stint as a mentor in March 2019, she noticed that the integration of female staff and cadets had been "stalled by cultural norms". She was the only female officer mentor and she worked with the women through an interpreter.

Her job was to try and get the females more accepted and involved, mainly through building up their confidence and communication skills. She found the opportunity to work alongside the Afghans incredibly rewarding. She said, "They taught me so much and the learning was definitely mutual. It was an awe-inspiring and humbling nine months". Frankie really enjoyed watching the women gain confidence in their own ability to use weapons and encouraging their male peers to accept them. Building up rapport and trust was imperative. A highlight was co-ordinating the first visit to the Academy by the Afghan Ministry of Defence gender and human rights director.

Although the sounds of war were all around her, Frankie didn't see much of the country. She lived in a secure compound and she wore body armour all the time. The New Zealand mandate was to fly everywhere. Frankie would return to Afghanistan in a heartbeat if she was again offered the opportunity

The Army has given Frankie some amazing opportunities and her next role is equally exciting. In January she is starting a new role in Wellington as the Aide-de-Camp to the Governor General Dame Patsy Reddy.
