Native plants flourishing at Taniwha Gully rock art site

An ancient rock art site, which includes a taniwha on the ceiling of a cave near Pleasant Point, is undergoing restoration with the help of \$14,000 of Immediate Steps biodiversity funding.

The Taniwha Gully area, leased by the Ngāi Tahu Māori Rock Art Trust, includes nationally significant Māori rock art sites. The funding is helping restore the gully site and

wetland, including a native planting programme, pest and weed control over the next two years.

Ecological restoration has been undertaken by the Trust since 2016 and has received previous support from the Orari Temuka Opihi Pareora (OTOP) Water Zone Committee, which makes recommendations for Immediate Steps funding to Environment Canterbury.

The OTOP Water Zone Committee is a joint committee made up of community members, rūnanga and local councils.

Hidden Oasis

At the end of a long, meandering, tree-lined driveway, past an eclectic collection of homes and well-established gardens, is a hidden oasis.

As you approach the property, the buildings appear first. A towering Mediterranean-style home, complete with turret, is linked by a covered walkway to a small, funky wooden studio. An atrium attached to the studio opens into the covered walkway, but all that is visible through the coloured glass in the front door is an external curved stone wall. It is immediately apparent this place is special. And when the promise of what lies behind that wall is revealed, it is breathtaking.

Grape vines hang off a pergola attached to the main house. There is an expanse of manicured lawn, leading to a pond surrounded by lush, tropical plantings and overlooked by 'The Love Shack' a small hut with a deck sitting right on the water's edge. Pathways and streams wind around the extensive, native-filled garden, which includes a mini beech forest, hostas, and ferns, and has things like roses, hydrangeas, bird of paradise, and bright geraniums in pots, to provide pops of colour. Spiky cacti, braziers, bubbling small ponds, a fire pit and an outdoor bath add to the garden's character and charm. There are many places to pause, reflect, and enjoy a new perspective on every aspect of this tranquil, private and calm space.

So where is this piece of paradise? What is almost impossible to believe is that this garden is right in the heart of Rangiora, with the bustling main thoroughfare of Ivory Street, just metres away.

The development of this magical garden is testament to a 35 year labour of love by Gerald Horton, and his late wife Rosie.

They came to Rangiora in 1985, as a young couple in search of "the good life". What they found was a one-and-three-quarter acre property, which was bare land, apart from several tunnel houses filled with table grapes. Gerald had already started a signwriting business in Christchurch but planned to leave that behind to run the established table grape business instead. "We hadn't done our homework very well and quickly realised that growing table grapes was a dying industry in New Zealand. I had to get back into signwriting pretty much straight away."

Gerald and Rosie moved a bus onto the property and lived in it with their two young sons, Mat and

Nick. "I told Rosie I'd build a house in six to 12 months, but it ended up going on hold because I had to build a sign shop first. The Love Shack was the first building we built on the property. It was supposed to be a studio for the business, but it was way too small, so I operated from a little shed down at the neighbour's market garden, Costessy, instead."

For three years, the family lived in the bus while they built their first house on the property, a board and batten home, not far from the Ivory Street entrance to the property. "It was amazing in the summertime, as the boys would pitch tents under the grape vines or around the property. In winter time we would all be back in the bus, which didn't have a scrap of insulation. It snowed during our last winter and was like living in an ice box."

The family lived in their new home for seven years, with truckloads of shingle brought in to form a driveway. "It was like driving up the Ashley River bed for many years, as we couldn't afford to have it properly done at that stage."

With the tunnel houses gone, apart from the 'Grape House' (later home to some of the Horton's legendary parties) Gerald had a vision for the property, which included later subdividing sections off for other homes, and developing the north end of the section for his family. 'I started working with John Archer of Earthworks to plan out the driveway and gardens around the house and to figure out where to develop the waterways, and plant mature trees to provide windbreaks around the property. Everything followed this landscape plan. I think it is important to have a vision, and not just plant a tree somewhere because someone gives it to you."

When they sold the board and batten house, Gerald and Rosie moved into a small one-bedroom wooden studio they had built at the north end of the property as a temporary home, while their forever home was being built. "I told Rosie it would be a couple of years before we built our dream home. In the end it was 13 years before we moved in. She never minded and was so patient."

The house, designed by local architect Robin White, is as unique as the highly creative couple. It looks like it would be just as much at home in

Tuscany as in the middle of Rangiora. One beloved aspect is the 'loggia' as Rosie referred to it, the Italian word for a covered exterior gallery or corridor. The loggia houses a massive table where many big sheltered outdoor dinners have been enjoyed. A room at the top of the home's turret and balconies off the upstairs master bedroom all provide sweeping views of the garden.

While he did all of the 'heavy lifting' when it came to the establishment of the garden, it was Rosie who was the main gardener, says Gerald. Her love of gardening is never far from his mind during the many hours he spends each week maintaining and continuing to develop the property. "I still follow her advice, especially when it comes to weed control. I'd get told off if I pulled a weed. She always insisted on using a carving knife to make sure all the roots came out as well. Her mantra was 'one year's seeds, seven years' weeds', and it drove me on when I took over the gardening."

Gerald also has a large vegetable garden, a glasshouse growing exotic fruits such as passionfruit, tamarillos and grapes, and a nursery where he propagates plants, mostly to give away. "So much of our garden has come from cuttings shared from other peoples' gardens, and I'm continuing that tradition on."

He is known by some neighbours as the 'Frog Man' due to the sound of the New Zealand native tree frogs on the property. "Sometimes their chorus goes on all night and what a beautiful sound it is. Makes you really feel that you are out in the bush somewhere."

Gerald loves to share the garden with others, and it has been the backdrop to many impromptu gatherings, parties, and organised events over the years, including youngest son Nick's wedding, back in 2011. "It was a thrill to host the wedding here and the place looked wonderful for it. Rosie did every bit of the catering herself, just like she did for all of the functions we held here. She was the best hostess. Like her mother, Rosie was also the matriarch of our family and was a stickler for keeping everyone together."

One of Gerald's favourite parts of the garden is on the steps of The Love Shack. "I love sitting there and looking across the pond - it's so restful."

A pepper tree in the east of the garden was one of Rosie's favourite spots and is where her ashes were laid to rest. "Rosie was so wonderful and artistic, and it is sad she hasn't been around these last eight years to enjoy our family, home and garden. I talk to her often about how proud she would be."

Vince the Vet

Timaru veterinarian Dr Vince Peterson was named a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit in the 2020 Queen's Birthday Honours list.



Priscilla Walker retired and Vince took up the administration of the practices in Geraldine, Fairlie and Pleasant Point, plus the two Timaru clinics in North Street and Otupua Road. The latter two clinics eventually centralized and became the Highfield Veterinary Clinic. He received the NZ Veterinary Association Presidents Award in 2009.



Vince retired from clinical practice in 2001 but he has continued his role on the Board of the Veterinary Professional Insurance Society. Its job is to insure veterinary practices against breach of duty claims. Vince has been an assessor for the society for 25 years. He chaired it for 20 years and oversaw its transition from a novice insurer to offering one of the profession's leading indemnity policies. Besides his long veterinary career, Vince is an avid fisherman and he builds fly rods and ties flies. He is also a life member of the Clay Target Association. In retrospect, after graduation Vince only thought he would be doing clinical work, so his venture into insurance was never envisaged or imagined! His MNZOM is a well-deserved award for his dedication to the veterinary profession.

He was rewarded for services to the veterinary profession over his career spanning more than 50 years. No-one was more surprised than Vince himself because, as he told me that, "the stuff I did was never done with any thought of recognition".

Vince was born in Fairlie and grew up on a farm in Seadown. He attended Washdyke Primary School, followed by TBHS and then he did his pre-vet medical intermediate at Canterbury University in 1959. Because the Bachelor of Veterinary Science was not taught in NZ at the time, Vince then furthered his study in Sydney from 1960-1963. He was one of 25 NZ students awarded a Veterinary Services Council bursary to do so.

On completion of his degree, Vince came back to NZ, where he was bonded for 5 years, and he spent 13 years working for the Veterinary Club in Hokitika, mostly working with large animals and mainly dairy cows. Small animals (cats and dogs) were fitted in when time allowed. The Veterinary Club was owned by farmers who hired the vets, so a very different system to today. The West Coast practice stretched from Paringa (150 miles south) to Seddonville (150 miles north) and east to the Maruia Valley, so his job involved a lot of travel. He was the sole vet on the West Coast for most of his first year after graduation and for approximately two years in total.

In 1964 there were no modern anaesthetics, few modern drugs, no broad spectrum anthelmintics, no new surgical techniques or mobile phones, so the vets were practising largely 'by the seat of their pants'! Nearly every herd of cows was milked by its owner, so the vets dealt directly with the owners and their workers and built up personal relationships. The dairy herds were also smaller, seldom more than 100 cows in the Hokitika area.

In 1977 Vince moved to Geraldine where he set up the Geraldine Veterinary Clinic and worked for ten years. In 1987 Dave and

The Four Winds Kristin Hannah

This is epic historical fiction: a harrowing, tough and painful read of one of American history's darkest periods, the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl, the tragedies, poverty, starvation, unemployment, the sacrifices made, set in Texas and California from the early 1920s up to WW2. This era is seen through the eyes of a woman, a mother, and her family. Elsa has suffered poor health, is from a wealthy family who make her feel she is never as good as her sisters, never loved, that results in her poor self-esteem. So when she receives attention from a younger man, Rafe Martinelli, she ends up pregnant, and despite him being already engaged, they find themselves married.

Elsa finds herself living on a farm, loved and thriving, despite it being a hard life of challenges, getting on well with her in-laws, Tony and Rosa, particularly close to Rosa, with two children, Loreda and Ant. However, living conditions become unbearable, particularly for the farming communities with the Depression, the lack of rain, the never-ending drought, the failing crops and the devastating dust storms and their dreadful impact, leading to people scattering in the winds. Despite everything, for obvious reasons Elsa is reluctant to leave until the life-threatening conditions worsen considerably, and they move to where it is said to be the land of milk and honey, California. In a relentlessly downbeat and bleak narrative, California is far from the promised land, instead they face endless prejudice and injustice.

Elsa is a mother, a strong, courageous and indomitable woman, there is nothing she will not do for her children. She is the hardest of workers, in a California that exploits, with terrible working conditions and pay. Despite everything, despite the horrors, what shines through is the underlying power of the human spirit, and its astonishing capacity to endure the worst of times, the despair, and survive, against all the odds. This book parallels and echoes our contemporary realities, the pandemic and its crushing impact, men in power that cannot be trusted, a divided nation, and a future that looks so bleak, offering hope by illustrating people's resilience from the past. This is not the easiest of reads, but it is nevertheless a powerful, compelling and riveting story of women and their relationships.





Prepare for Winter

Get your car serviced before the winter.

This should include:

- Battery test – most dealers do this for free
- Engine coolant (if needed) and fill it with quality antifreeze mix
- Lights and reflectors – keep spare fuses in the vehicle
- Wind screen washer filled with quality antifreeze fluid mix
- Tyres and spare wheel – most dealers do this for free. A minimum of 3mm thread is recommended – (the law says minimum 1.5mm but that is not the safest option)
- Brake, clutch and transmission fluid levels
- Engine oil level

SURVIVAL KIT

- Ice scraper, clean cloth/towel, and small shovel
- Sand/bag of cat litter or other traction aid
- Booster cables
- Road flares or warning lights
- Torch and charged batteries
- First aid kit
- Small car tool kit
- Extra clothing and footwear

- Blankets
- Non-perishable foods and water
- Fully charged battery bank 20-30,000mAh
- Fat candle and matches and clean empty metal tin
- Tow rope

A Little Bit of History

The very first Mackenzie A & P Show was held in 1899 and was a huge success with people arriving by trap, sulky, wagon, horseback and train from all over the region. There were over 178 entries in the various classes which included cattle, horse sheep, dog and poultry.

A long write up in the South Canterbury Times refers to it as the Mackenzie County Autumn Show and states that "Easter Monday of 1899 will long be remembered at Fairlie as the day on which the Mackenzie County Agricultural Society held its first Show... The show itself for a first year and for a country district was very good."

Now over 120 years later the show is still running and this year promises to be a really great event for all the family.



Bottling your Beetroot



Beetroot (beta vulgaris) is a root vegetable packed with essential nutrients. Beetroots are a great source of fiber, folate (vitamin B9), manganese, potassium, iron, and vitamin C.

Beetroots and beetroot juice have been associated with numerous health benefits, including improved blood flow, lower blood pressure, and increased exercise performance.

Many of these benefits are due to their high content of inorganic nitrates.

Beetroots are delicious raw but more frequently cooked or pickled. Their leaves — known as beet greens — can also be eaten.

Here is a great recipe and method from Steve Ditmer for preserving your own beetroot!



Prep:

- Sterilize jars by washing thoroughly and then placing in a hot oven approx 180°C to sterilize.
- Sterilize lids in a saucepan of boiling water.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup of malt vinegar
- 1 cup of sugar
- 2 cups of water
- Salt and pepper.

This will make two jars. Double if bottling more.

Method:

- Leave 1cm of stalk on the beetroot so not to lose colour while cooking.
- Boil beetroot for approx 40 minutes or until it can be pierced through with a sharp knife.
- While beetroot is cooking mix the vinegar recipe and bring to boil in a saucepan for approx 5 minutes.
- Empty the pot of cooked beetroot into a sink and when cool enough to handle simply rub the skins off with your hands.
- Quickly slice warm beetroot into the hot jars and when full scoop the boiling vinegar mixture on top of the sliced beetroot.
- Run a sharp knife around the side of the jars to release any air bubbles and then top to overflowing. Quickly put lids on and screw down the bands tightly.
- Within 30 minutes you should see the lids invert down which is the sealing process as the mixture cools.
- Leave for a few weeks then enjoy. Bottled beetroot will last for up to a year if kept in a cool dark place.


