

Gwenyth Wilson is a founding member and patron of the South Canterbury Hospice, being made a Life Member in 2000. She was the Treasurer of the initial hospice committee, vowing to raise \$100,000 for this very worthwhile venture. She has designed many beautiful gardens, including the hospice garden and she was instrumental in obtaining and naming the special Loving Care hospice rose.

Gwenyth and her husband Bernie created their beautiful Goodstock Gardens Nursery in Pleasant Point from a bare paddock in 1992. They wanted to be on the flat, rather than up on the hill, because it was easier to put down a well to keep the garden watered. The original house on the site had burned down, so there were

paths and rubble to clear away before Gwenyth could work her magic. Bernie and Gwenyth had already established several large gardens, so this was just another challenge for this creative woman. The highlight of the original garden was the 100 plus roses, which they have gradually reduced over the years. Bernie told me that they now only have about 70 roses, those that don't need spraving! With many of the original roses removed and given away, this made way for more lawn. Bernie is in charge of mowing the lawns and cutting the hedges and they both take care of the edges!







## **Boy Swallows**

## Universe Trent Dalton

A novel of love, crime, magic, fate and UNIVERSE coming of age, set in Brisbane's violent working class suburban fringe in 1983. Twelve year old Eli Bell lives with his mum Frances and stepdad Lyle in the Brisbane suburbs. He seemingly has a normal Aussie childhood, tearing off on his bike, playing in the streets and worshipping the Parramatta Eels. Except for the fact that TRENT his older brother Gus is mute, having elected to give up speaking some years ago (after a traumatic event), his parents are drug dealers DALTON and his babysitter is a notorious ex-crim called Slim (based on a real life character also known as the Houdini of Boggo Road). That all changes when Lyle is caught out by his boss doing a bit of extracurricular dealing and is dragged off by his brutal henchman never to be seen again, Eli's Mum is sent to jail and Eli and Gus go to live with their depressed, drunken father.

Despite all the violence and crime around him, Eli wants to grow up to be a good person and become a journalist, providing he can navigate his way through warring street gangs and heroin dealers, somehow survive school and find a paper willing to take him on. His love for his mother, stepfather Lyle, his father and brother shines out.

Trent Dalton has somehow managed to spin a yarn about a Brisbane boy growing up amidst poverty, violence and crime while infusing it with love, joy and humour. The little bluebird in the centre on the cover has a significant meaning for Eli, and the three word title and chapter headings reflect advice given to Eli when he meets his future news editor - that a story should be able to be summed up in three words! Not an easy read but I couldn't put it down!

A journey through the most unlikely of gardens: the oases of peace people create in the midst of war.

This is a beautiful book. 





## Mandy Wills Working with Migrants

South Canterbury is a great place for migrants and newcomers to settle. It has good opportunities for families, housing is affordable and the region is experiencing economic growth. Migrants enrich our community and we need to understand their differences and learn about their different cultures, just as much as they need to learn about ours. I had a chat with Mandy Wills about her job:

### **O.** What is your role with the Aoraki **Migrant Centre?**

We support, connect and celebrate the multi-cultural communities of Aoraki. Katie Houstoun (the migrant support manager) and I have the job of supporting anyone who is new in Timaru, not only new migrants and former refugees, but also some who are already permanent residents. We ensure that these people know about the amazing services and support that are available to them in our community. We want them to be happy and settled here, to integrate into our community and to become productive citizens. It is really important that we understand and value their cultural differences and that they can understand and value ours

### Q. What sorts of things do you do to achieve this?

Weekly coffee group meetings help them to connect with others of their culture, many of whom feel quite isolated, because it is usually the husband who works and the wife is often left alone at home. Supportive friendships have resulted from this connection. Families are reliant on being able to work, which means having a visa for which they are sponsored. If the job finishes and their visa expires, they must find a new sponsor and it is expensive to renew visas. During Covid, there have been lots of job losses especially in the hospitality industry and the Migrant Centre and Family Works have been proactive in providing financial support, food and blankets to these people. One example was at the Hermitage at Mt Cook, where 170 lost their jobs and Craighead families generously donated enormous amounts of food and clothing to help these dispossessed families.

Another successful example was the Comm- Unity Day held at the SBS stadium on Race Relations Day. This was real celebration of different cultures with ten different food stalls, cultural performances, and inter-active activities such as learning how to do Indian henna, make Tongan lolly leis, construct Japanese origami and Chinese lanterns. For the children, the police and firemen helped them construct Lego masterpieces. The



latter activity created healthy connections and helped build trust with these organisations.

Several of the cultural societies such as the Tongan Society and the Timaru Filipino Society have many members and run regular events and we happily support these

Immigration advice is vital and we refer to specialised services. Stafford Personnel are helping with teaching interview skills and creating a CV and the YMCA are helping fund migrants to get their drivers licences. Community support is so important for social integration and for migrants to know that people care in times of adversity.

### **Q. You obviously love this job?**

It is an incredibly rewarding and interesting job. We are a small team with a supportive, unique and diverse Board. It is a privilege to work with migrants, former refugees and newcomers who are so grateful for our help. They need to learn where to go for help when there are problems and good listeners are very important. No two days are the same. However, we could do better. We need to get to know and to better understand other cultures and to reduce the fear of the unknown. A little bit of support goes a long way and can have a real impact on their lives.

Investing in a wall-mounted charger can save you time and sanity. You can charge overnight, waking up ready to go with a charged vehicle. You can even programme some to turn on

Driving an electric vehicle means being prepared to make frequent and longer stops and sometimes taking alternate routes. Download an EV plug app and plan your route using

If you're running low on battery, switch off the radio, unplug your phone, and turn off any air-con or heating. These things won't dramatically affect your range but they can make the difference when kilometres are crucial. Kanye West famously said, "if you ain't no punk, holla we want prenup, we want prenup" but what is a prenup and when should you get one?

In New Zealand a pre-nuptial agreement is referred to as a Contracting Out Agreement or section 21 Agreement. This is because it is an agreement contracting out of the Property (Relationships) Act 1976.

The majority of Contracting Out Agreements are entered into in the first three years of a relationship as, generally speaking, once a relationship is longer than three years relationship property is divided equally between the parties. The other main time people enter into these agreements is when they are purchasing a property together, or receiving inheritance or a gift from family. Remember that income earnt during a relationship is relationship property and everything that is bought with that income becomes relationship property.

Whether you should look at a Contracting Out Agreement depends on your personal circumstances (age, work arrangements, assets etc). If you're buying a house and contributing different amounts then a Contracting Out Agreement can be entirely appropriate. Where you both have similar assets and incomes it may be that there is no need for a Contracting Out Agreement.

If you believe that you do need a Contracting Out Agreement, it's important to think about what you are trying to achieve. Are you just wanting to protect property you owned pre relationship or future property as well? It's important that you consider what the effect and implications of an agreement are when it's signed but also into the future.

For a Contracting Out Agreement to be legally binding both parties need to receive independent legal advice on its terms.
