



More than a phristmas Tree

Covered in twinkling lights, tasteful red and gold baubles, and topped with a mighty glowing star, Twizel's seven-metre-high community Christmas tree represents much more than just the holiday season. "This tree represents a collective effort," explains Amy Oughton, co-founder of The Twizel Mistletoe Group, which purchased the tree in 2022. "It's a testament to what we can achieve when we come together."

The Twizel Mistletoe Group started after a post on the Twizel Community Facebook page in November 2021, when a local pointed out the somewhat lacklustre decorations strung on a tree in the central marketplace. "Conversations with fellow community members revealed a shared desire for more festive cheer," explains Amy. "So a group of us, united by our enthusiasm for Christmas, decided it was time to rekindle the town's Christmas spirit."

The team reached out to the 1800-strong Twizel community for funds and were met with an "astonishingly swift and enthusiastic" response, raising \$35,000 comprising "a heartwarming blend of contributions from individuals, local families, and businesses."

The group also had to apply for special Council consent to erect the tree and adhere to rules for lighting a shining seven-metrehigh beacon within the International Dark Sky Reserve in which Twizel sits But with hard work and determination the Twizel Mistletoe Group's Christmas wishes came true, and the tree was lit up at a community ceremony on December 2nd, 2022.

The logistics of purchasing, shipping and setting up a Christmas tree of this stature, however, proved rather more difficult.

"This wasn't just any tree; it needed to be a purpose-built outdoor marvel, sturdy enough to withstand the Mackenzie Country's robust winds. It took nine months to build it and have it shipped from China. Organising the logistics of transporting the tree, which arrived in multiple parts, was another

With the festive season upon us once again, the majestic tree has been pulled from storage. Local builders and businesses have been busy installing the tree's base, erecting the metal frame, placing the decorations with a cherry-picker, and setting up security fencing. Community members came to "fluff the branches", and gathered one evening for a Christmas concert and the switching on of the lights: a series of annual events that are now the new Christmas norm for the town of Twizel.

"It's clear that our tree is much more than just a decoration," says Amy. "It's a focal point of community happiness and a sparkling

It's been great to see the new Timaru tree bring a festive air to our town. The new Christmas tree has been installed on the Piazza, the angels hover above Stafford St and the star shines over the city from the fire tower.

"It is just absolutely wonderful that we can have a bit of Christmas cheer through the CBD, we had a lot of positive feedback from the public as the tree is being installed," Land Transport Manager Susannah Ratahi said. "We decided to put the tree up a bit earlier than December because we wanted to make sure it was ready for the Timaru Christmas Parade along the main street."

The tree reaches a height of 10 meters including the star, the weighted base platform internal ballast, all decorations and branches equal around 7000kg. It has been designed to withstand winds of 150kph winds on the Piazza, and the structure hosts 275 metre of string lights which is around 11 laps of the indoor CBay pool, or roughly the distance from Ballantynes to the Old Bank.

"With a lifespan of 20 years, the Christmas Tree will be an enduring feature to Timaru for years to come," said Susannah. "We have seen some incredible feedback from the community, and we are glad to be one of the catalysts for community Christmas spirit."



The road to Mesopotamia Station is a lonely one. The desolate gravel route cuts its way through ochre tussock and wide, open farmland, winding endlessly onwards towards the towering foothills of the mighty Southern Alps. Beneath the expansive, ever-changing sky, the spectacular Rangitata River makes its relentless run towards the distant coast. Often, there's not a soul to be seen.

You will, however, spot the postie. Five days a week, Matt Searles travels this road, 50km in each direction, delivering letters and parcels to the 16 mailboxes between Peel Forest and the historic Mesopotamia Station. And every day, without fail, he brings his camera.

"I've always looked on a day out with my camera as a day well spent," says Matt, who first picked up a camera as a child in the UK. It wasn't until years later, having moved to New Zealand with his Kiwi wife Shelley, that Matt started taking photography seriously. "I started a photo-a-day challenge - taking a photo each day for a whole year - and I did this for three years. Since then, photography has been a massive part of my daily life."

> In 2018, Matt and Shelley bought The Green Man café at Peel Forest. The couple had moved to the tiny village four years earlier, from Banks Peninsula, wanting to be closer to Shelly's family in Timaru. "When we moved, it was a question of finding somewhere that was similar in pace of life and proximity to nature as Banks Peninsula. Peel Forest fit the bill perfectly."

Formerly the village store and post office, The Green Man came with the responsibility of the local mail run. "The mail run has been handed down to each owner of the store," explains Matt. "So I started the run from Peel Forest to Mesopotamia Station on June 1st, 2018."

"I'll never forget my first day. It was a hoar frost, so everything was a magical winter wonderland." With such a landscape literally on his doorstep, it's no surprise that the photographer in Matt kicked into gear and started documenting the scenic journey to Mesopotamia Station, thus beginning a daily photographic record of his rural mail run, which he dubbed 'Mail to Messy'.

Matt's stunning, ongoing photo series features the changing seasons of this spectacular part of the world, showing the remarkable landscapes, hardy locals, rugged work dogs, farming life, and classic rural New Zealand in all its day-to-day glory.





"I liken it to a 'spot-the-difference' competition; each day so many things remain unchanged but each day there are subtle differences to be explored. For me, the most enjoyable days are the ones where the weather and light is changing, with storms brewing in the mountains or fog rolling in from the plains. The days when the valley is blanketed in snow are always really special."



Unsurprisingly, Mail to Messy has proven popular. Sales via Instagram, Matt's website and from The Green Man café have been steady. The project has also been featured in a short film, a podcast and in international photography

"Seeing these images allows people to reconnect with the rural nature of our country," says Matt. "Like so many photographs, there is a sense of nostalgia in them that appeals to people. I think the idea of this mail man in the middle of rural New Zealand taking all these images really appeals too."

"I liken it to a 'spotthe-difference' competition; each day so many things remain unchanged but each day there are subtle differences to be explored."

This summer, Matt will be out there, capturing the long, dry days, the sun-goldened paddocks and the cloudless blue skies whilst also running The Green Man with Shelley, catering events, visiting family and capturing the occasional wedding or commercial shoot. It's a busy life, but at the end of the day, it all comes back to his camera.

"Being behind the camera gives me a sense of calm. In a world where so much happens that you can't control, that's a very comforting thing."

Keeping your child safe

Keeping your child safe is one of the most crucial jobs you have as a parent, and one of the most important things you'll buy for your child is a carseat.

Right from the beginning, whether you take your baby home from hospital or the first time leaving your home, you need an appropriate car seat until they grow big enough to fit an adult seatbelt, at approximately 148cm tall. That's why we say "It's safer to wait until 148".

There is no single "best carseat" out there. The best car seat is the one that fits YOUR child's weight, height and age, and is properly fitted into YOUR vehicle, ensuring maximum safety if the unfortunate event of a crash was to happen.

As your child grows, you will need to transition from one car seat stage to another, but with each stage you may lose safety and protection, so it is important not to make the move to the next stage too early.

Five ways to ensure your child's carseat is safe.

Make sure that the seat fits the child.

 Different carseats have different height, weight and age limits, which can be confusing so make sure you check out the specifications of the seat before you purchase. You could have the "Safest" seat on the market but if your child is not in an age appropriate seat, they may receive life threatening injuries in a crash.

Make sure the seat fits the vehicle.

2. Make sure the seat fits the venicie. Different makes, models and years of cars have different shaped seats, different material, differing usable space to work with. Some cars don't have an anchor point installed, some vehicles don't have isofix compatibility, some cars have inflatable airbags in the seatbelt. You could have the "safest" seat on the market but if it doesn't fit your vehicle then it will not perform how it should in a crash.

Make sure the seat is being used correctly. **3**• Make sure the seat is being used. This involves having tight, untwisted straps. Chest clip in the correct position (if there is one as some seats do not use them). Straps at the correct height. No aftermarket accessories added. You could have the "Safest" seat on the market but if your child is not properly restrained in the seat, they may be ejected from the seat in a crash.

Make sure it is installed correctly. This involves **4** Make sure it is instance community making sure the tether (if the seat has one) is attached to the appropriate anchor point. A tight install on either seatbelt or isofix (but not both!) The seat is reclined to the appropriate angle if rear facing. The carseat is not braced to the vehicle's front seat unless specified in the carseat and vehicle's manual. You could have the "Safest"



appiness Through Baking

Good Bitches Baking (GBB) is a national organization that helps to spread a little happiness by delivering home baked goods to those who might be having a tough day. There are 'chapters' all over the country and we recently got to chat with Richard Doran, 'head bitch' of the Timaru Chapter

A father of two and a business development manager in his day job, Richard, joined the Timaru chapter of GBB four years ago. It was a little gentle pressure from his two sisters, who both baked for GBB, that got him involved.

Having grown up with a mother who was a keen baker, Richard tapped into some of those old family recipes and started spreading a little kindness in the community

"The very first time I baked chocolate chip cookies and they were going to hospice. Then I did a chocolate cake and that was going to women's refuge. It's quite a different concept baking something and sending it off to complete strangers," he says.

It may be a different concept but it's one that resonates with both the volunteers and the recipients. There are currently 32 'active' bakers in the Timaru area says Richard. And the baking can be anything from simple cookies to slices, muffins or beautifully decorated big cakes. While the volunteers' baking and delivery is rostered each month, Richard loves that his volunteers are always prepared to whip up something delicious at a moment's notice if needed.

The bakers are provided with a box to put the baking in and a card where they write the ingredients of the item. As well as a note to the recipient - and these can really vary says Richard. Some may write poems, some may send a message, some decorate them with stickers and sparkles. They are all unique and made and sent with love.

Aside from the actual baking there are also logistics involved. The baking has to be collected from all the bakers and delivered to the recipients. Two of the core groups that GBB Timaru deliver baking to are Women's Refuge and the hospice – but they also have delivered to a wide range of support groups and other volunteer organisations and charities in the area.

It's all about spreading a little happiness says Richard, about providing something nice to somebody who might be having a really bad day. And whilst the bakers often don't receive feedback – when it does come it can be really meaningful. Richard tells of a group they baked for that was running a workshop for people struggling with addiction issues. Some of those that received the baking said it lifted their spirits because getting baking from the community shows that people still care and that the recipients are still part of that community.

"Some have even been inspired to bake themselves" says Richard. "So if we can show there is kindness out there and actually encourage others. It's an easy way to spread a little happiness."

Ingredients

200 ml cream

1⁄2 cup soft brown sugar

¼ cup demerara sugar

Brazil nuts or almonds thinly sliced.

Method

Drain yoghurt in a large sieve lined with a couple of paper towels for 30 minutes. Carefully peel the yoghurt off paper, scraping it into a bowl. Whip the cream until stiff, then fold into bowl of yoghurt. Transfer to a shallow dish. Sprinkle with brown sugar, then sprinkle with demerara sugar. There should be a nice thick coating of sugar on top but don't overdo it. Cover yoghurt cream with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 8 – 12 hours.

One hour before serving put raspberries and blueberries in a bowl. Hull the strawberries slice and add to the bowl. Stir gently and refrigerate

We recently caught up with NZ natural lipstick queen, Karen Murrell to ask her a few questions about lip care and colours.

How do we keep lips soft and smooth in summer? Keeping lips well exfoliated and nourished helps your lipstick application look better and last longer. I recommend using a lip scrub (my favourite for summer is the Watermelon or Mint Lip Scrubs from the Island Goddess Collection) either in the shower or at the basin each night and then apply some Moisture Stick to seal in hydration.

How do we use a lip scrub? Simply apply directly to dry lips, rub lips together to continue to work in and then remove with a clean damp washcloth. Lip scrub can be incorporated as part of your morning routine to create a smooth canvas prior to make-up application, or just before bed to encourage overnight skin rejuvenation.

What lipstick colours should we have in our makeup bags? When I travel I only take three colours with me. One neutral nude shade as this is good for weekends and casual meetings. I go for a red or orange shade for evenings or days when I'm feeling bolder or need to feel empowered. Finally, one pink shade which I tend to wear on days to work when I'm wanting to be more fashion orientated.








Demon Copperhead Barbara Kingsolver

With the holiday season coming up many of us will be taking long car journeys whether it's heading to our favourite campground or visiting family.

Many of us are aware of the road rules and things that make for dangerous driving – but we still break the rules. Whether that's sneaking a look at our phones in traffic or failing to wear our seatbelts. But the reality is that a silly decision can have lifelong consequences. So wherever you're heading please stay safe on the roads these holidays.

The Road Safety team at Timaru District Council shared the following key advice with us. If you're setting off on a long car journey, whether you're the driver or a passenger, then

please take a moment to read them. They might just save your life.

- Plan your journey and allow time for breaks and traffic. There will be more traffic on the road than usual.
- Always wear your seat belt and make sure your passengers wear theirs. Seat belts save lives.
- Be patient and enjoy the journey to your destination. Traffic and 'slow' drivers can be frustrating for some but getting to your destination safely is more important than any lost time.
- Slow down and keep an eye on your speed, it can easily creep up over the limit

- Take regular rest breaks and share the driving when possible
- Don't drink alcohol and drive you put yourself and your passengers at risk. So if you know you're going to be drinking, make a plan to get home.
- Don't get distracted while driving. One of the key distractions for looking at your phone. So put your phone on silent and out of reach so you're not tempted to check it when you should have your eyes on the road.
- Road signs exist for a reason to warn you about bends, or intersections or other road conditions. Look at them while you're driving and act accordingly.
- Look ahead the sooner you identify a potential hazard the more time you have to react to the situation.
- Look around you not just straight ahead don't forget to use your mirrors and be aware of any surrounding traffic.
- Let's work together to keep our roads safer this summer.
